| quivering | Trembling or shaking with a slight rapid motion. <i>A man with a quivering voice.</i> |
| <u>resonant</u> | Relating to or bringing about resonance in a circuit, atom, or other object. <i>The sound is produced by striking resonant little metal bars.</i> |
| resounding | Characterized by resonance. <i>The evening was a resounding success.</i> |
| reverberant | Having a tendency to reverberate or be repeatedly reflected. <i>A reverberant room.</i> |
| reverberating | Characterized by resonance. |
| rich | Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>Many vegetables and fruits are rich in vitamins.</i> |
| <u>ringing</u> | Having or emitting a clear resonant sound. <i>A ringing voice.</i> |
| <u>shaky</u> | Not safe or reliable; liable to fail or falter. <i>A wobbly chair with shaky legs.</i> |
| shivering | Vibrating slightly and irregularly; as e.g. with fear or cold or like the leaves of an aspen in a breeze. <i>Sparkling light from the shivering crystals of the chandelier.</i> |
| shivery | Provoking fear terror. <i>He felt cold and shivery.</i> |
| shuddering | Characterized or accompanied by violent shaking or vibration. <i>Her breath came in shuddering gasps.</i> |
| shuddery | Provoking fear terror. <i>The most terrible and shuddery tales of murder and revenge.</i> |
| sonorous | Capable of producing a deep or ringing sound. <i>He read aloud with a sonorous and musical voice.</i> |

| <u>striking</u> | Attracting attention by reason of being unusual, extreme, or prominent. <i>His striking good looks always created a sensation.</i> |
| strong | Relating to or denoting the strongest of the known kinds of force between particles which acts between nucleons and other hadrons when closer than about 10 cm so binding protons in a nucleus despite the repulsion due to their charge and which conserves strangeness parity and isospin. <i>Strong cheese.</i> |

vivacious

Attractively lively and animated (typically used of a woman).
*A **vivacious** folk dance.*

vivacity

(especially in a woman) the quality of being attractively lively and animated.
*He was struck by her **vivacity** humour and charm.*

vivid

Having the clarity and freshness of immediate experience.
*A bird with **vivid** plumage.*

zesty

Marked by spirited enjoyment.
