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• Associations of "Vicariously" (30 Words)

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accessory	Someone who helps another person commit a crime. Functionally the maxillae are a pair of accessory jaws.
additional	Added, extra, or supplementary to what is already present or available. <i>Called for additional troops.</i>
additive	A substance added to something in small quantities to improve or preserve it. The combination of these factors has an additive effect.
adjunct	A person who is an assistant or subordinate to another. Computer technology is an adjunct to learning.
alternate	Of leaves or shoots placed alternately on the two sides of the stem. <i>Alternate</i> bouts of intense labour and of idleness.
ancillary	A person whose work provides necessary support to the primary activities of an organization, system, etc. <i>An ancillary pump.</i>
appendage	A part that is joined to something larger. A pair of feathery appendage s through which oxygen is absorbed.
assistant	A person who helps in particular work. A care assistant .
auxiliary	An auxiliary verb. <i>Auxiliary</i> airport staff.
byproduct	A product made during the manufacture of something else.
costs	Pecuniary reimbursement to the winning party for the expenses of litigation.
extra	Excessive or extravagant. Extra ribs as well as other supernumerary internal parts.
extraneous	Not pertinent to the matter under consideration. Other insects attach extraneous objects or material to themselves.



<u>insignificant</u>	(of a person) without power or influence. A minor insignificant bureaucrat.
instead	As a substitute or alternative to; in place of. Used English terms instead of Latin ones.
levy	An act of levying a tax fee or fine. There will be powers to levy the owner.
<u>minor</u>	Of a key or mode based on a minor scale and tending to produce a sad or pensive effect. <i>A minor poet.</i>
<u>plus</u>	(after a grade) rather better than. A grade of C plus .
<u>secondary</u>	A secondary coil or winding in an electrical transformer. When a bear eats a plant eating rodent the bear is functioning as a secondary consumer.
standby	The state of waiting to secure an unreserved place for a journey or performance, allocated on the basis of earliest availability. <i>Buses were placed on standby for the journey to London.</i>
<u>subordinate</u>	Make subordinate dependent or subservient. In adventure stories character must be subordinate to action.
subsidiary	A company controlled by a holding company. All the firm s subsidiary companies have to operate under broad general guidelines.
<u>substitute</u>	Act or serve as a substitute. This was substitute d by a new clause.
supersede	Take the place of (a person or thing previously in authority or use); supplant. <i>The older models of car have now been</i> supersede <i>d</i> .
supplementary	A supplementary person or thing. Produced supplementary volumes.
surcharge	Mark a postage stamp with a surcharge. <i>Retailers will be able to surcharge credit card users.</i>
<u>tertiary</u>	Coming next after the second and just before the fourth in position. The tertiary consumers must hunt for their food.
tributary	(of a stream) flowing into a larger stream. A tributary colony.
unessential	Not basic or fundamental. A train has broken down resulting in a call to postpone all unessential travel.



unimportant Lacking in importance or significance. *Trivial and unimportant details.*
