## Associations of "Vicariously" (30 Words)

<b>accessory</b>	Someone who helps another person commit a crime. <i>Functionally the maxillae are a pair of <b>accessory</b> jaws.</i>
<b>additional</b>	Added, extra, or supplementary to what is already present or available. <i>Called for <b>additional</b> troops.</i>
<b>additive</b>	A substance added to something in small quantities to improve or preserve it. <i>The combination of these factors has an <b>additive</b> effect.</i>
<b>adjunct</b>	A person who is an assistant or subordinate to another. <i>Computer technology is an <b>adjunct</b> to learning.</i>
<b>alternate</b>	Of leaves or shoots placed alternately on the two sides of the stem. <i><b>Alternate</b> bouts of intense labour and of idleness.</i>
<a href="#">ancillary</a>	A person whose work provides necessary support to the primary activities of an organization, system, etc. <i>An <b>ancillary</b> pump.</i>
<b>appendage</b>	A part that is joined to something larger. <i>A pair of feathery <b>appendages</b> through which oxygen is absorbed.</i>
<b>assistant</b>	A person who helps in particular work. <i>A care <b>assistant</b>.</i>
<b>auxiliary</b>	An auxiliary verb. <i><b>Auxiliary</b> airport staff.</i>
<a href="#">byproduct</a>	A product made during the manufacture of something else.
<b>costs</b>	Pecuniary reimbursement to the winning party for the expenses of litigation.
<b>extra</b>	Excessive or extravagant. <i><b>Extra</b> ribs as well as other supernumerary internal parts.</i>
<b>extraneous</b>	Not pertinent to the matter under consideration. <i>Other insects attach <b>extraneous</b> objects or material to themselves.</i>

<b><u>insignificant</u></b>	(of a person) without power or influence. <i>A minor <b>insignificant</b> bureaucrat.</i>
<b>instead</b>	As a substitute or alternative to; in place of. <i>Used English terms <b>instead</b> of Latin ones.</i>
<b>levy</b>	An act of levying a tax fee or fine. <i>There will be powers to <b>levy</b> the owner.</i>
<b><u>minor</u></b>	Of a key or mode based on a minor scale and tending to produce a sad or pensive effect. <i>A <b>minor</b> poet.</i>
<b><u>plus</u></b>	(after a grade) rather better than. <i>A grade of C <b>plus</b>.</i>
<b><u>secondary</u></b>	A secondary coil or winding in an electrical transformer. <i>When a bear eats a plant eating rodent the bear is functioning as a <b>secondary</b> consumer.</i>
<b>standby</b>	The state of waiting to secure an unreserved place for a journey or performance, allocated on the basis of earliest availability. <i>Buses were placed on <b>standby</b> for the journey to London.</i>
<b><u>subordinate</u></b>	Make subordinate dependent or subservient. <i>In adventure stories character must be <b>subordinate</b> to action.</i>
<b>subsidiary</b>	A company controlled by a holding company. <i>All the firm s <b>subsidiary</b> companies have to operate under broad general guidelines.</i>
<b><u>substitute</u></b>	Act or serve as a substitute. <i>This was <b>substituted</b> by a new clause.</i>
<b>supersede</b>	Take the place of (a person or thing previously in authority or use); supplant. <i>The older models of car have now been <b>superseded</b>.</i>
<b>supplementary</b>	A supplementary person or thing. <i>Produced <b>supplementary</b> volumes.</i>
<b>surcharge</b>	Mark a postage stamp with a surcharge. <i>Retailers will be able to <b>surcharge</b> credit card users.</i>
<b><u>tertiary</u></b>	Coming next after the second and just before the fourth in position. <i>The <b>tertiary</b> consumers must hunt for their food.</i>
<b>tributary</b>	(of a stream) flowing into a larger stream. <i>A <b>tributary</b> colony.</i>
<b>unessential</b>	Not basic or fundamental. <i>A train has broken down resulting in a call to postpone all <b>unessential</b> travel.</i>
