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Associations of "Vicariously" (30 Words)

accessory	Someone who helps another person commit a crime. <i>Functionally the maxillae are a pair of accessory jaws.</i>
additional	Added, extra, or supplementary to what is already present or available. <i>Called for additional troops.</i>
additive	A substance added to something in small quantities to improve or preserve it. <i>The combination of these factors has an additive effect.</i>
adjunct	A person who is an assistant or subordinate to another. <i>Computer technology is an adjunct to learning.</i>
alternate	Of leaves or shoots placed alternately on the two sides of the stem. <i>Alternate bouts of intense labour and of idleness.</i>
ancillary	A person whose work provides necessary support to the primary activities of an organization, system, etc. <i>An ancillary pump.</i>
appendage	A part that is joined to something larger. <i>A pair of feathery appendages through which oxygen is absorbed.</i>
assistant	A person who helps in particular work. <i>A care assistant.</i>
auxiliary	An auxiliary verb. <i>Auxiliary airport staff.</i>
byproduct	A product made during the manufacture of something else.
costs	Pecuniary reimbursement to the winning party for the expenses of litigation.
extra	Excessive or extravagant. <i>Extra ribs as well as other supernumerary internal parts.</i>
extraneous	Not pertinent to the matter under consideration. <i>Other insects attach extraneous objects or material to themselves.</i>

<u>insignificant</u>	(of a person) without power or influence. <i>A minor insignificant bureaucrat.</i>
instead	As a substitute or alternative to; in place of. <i>Used English terms instead of Latin ones.</i>
levy	An act of levying a tax fee or fine. <i>There will be powers to levy the owner.</i>
<u>minor</u>	Of a key or mode based on a minor scale and tending to produce a sad or pensive effect. <i>A minor poet.</i>
<u>plus</u>	(after a grade) rather better than. <i>A grade of C plus.</i>
<u>secondary</u>	A secondary coil or winding in an electrical transformer. <i>When a bear eats a plant eating rodent the bear is functioning as a secondary consumer.</i>
standby	The state of waiting to secure an unreserved place for a journey or performance, allocated on the basis of earliest availability. <i>Buses were placed on standby for the journey to London.</i>
<u>subordinate</u>	Make subordinate dependent or subservient. <i>In adventure stories character must be subordinate to action.</i>
subsidiary	A company controlled by a holding company. <i>All the firm s subsidiary companies have to operate under broad general guidelines.</i>
<u>substitute</u>	Act or serve as a substitute. <i>This was substituted by a new clause.</i>
supersede	Take the place of (a person or thing previously in authority or use); supplant. <i>The older models of car have now been superseded.</i>
supplementary	A supplementary person or thing. <i>Produced supplementary volumes.</i>
surcharge	Mark a postage stamp with a surcharge. <i>Retailers will be able to surcharge credit card users.</i>
<u>tertiary</u>	Coming next after the second and just before the fourth in position. <i>The tertiary consumers must hunt for their food.</i>
tributary	(of a stream) flowing into a larger stream. <i>A tributary colony.</i>
unessential	Not basic or fundamental. <i>A train has broken down resulting in a call to postpone all unessential travel.</i>
