*Improper* medication.



inaccurate Not accurate.

An **inaccurate** translation.

iniquity Immoral or grossly unfair behaviour.

A den of **iniquity**.

**Lack** of fairness or justice.

She was taken aback by the **injustice** of Nora s remark.

malevolence The quality of threatening evil.

His eyes were glowing with **malevolence**.

Wishing or appearing to wish evil to others; arising from intense ill will or

malevolent hatred.

Failure made him **malevolent** toward those who were successful.

malice Feeling a need to see others suffer. *I bear no malice towards anybody.* 

maliciousness Feeling a need to see others suffer.

mischief

Harm or trouble caused by someone or something.

She ll make sure Danny doesn t get into **mischief**.

misinterpret Interpret wrongly.

Don t **misinterpret** my comments as criticism.

nefarious (typically of an action or activity) wicked or criminal.

The **nefarious** activities of the organized crime syndicates.

Malevolence by virtue of being malicious or spiteful or nasty.

It seemed as if the wind had a **spite** at her.

Tending to betray especially having a treacherous character as attributed

**treacherous** to the Carthaginians by the Romans.

Memory is particularly **treacherous**.

**ugliness** Qualities of appearance that do not give pleasure to the senses.

The sheer **ugliness** of this architectural monstrosity.

unethical Not conforming to approved standards of social or professional behavior.

**Unethical** business practices.

Violating principles of justice.

unjust Unjust punishment.

wickedness The quality of being wicked.
