bad	Feeling physical discomfort or pain tough is occasionally used colloquially for bad. A bad report card.
betrayer	One who reveals confidential information in return for money.
<u>culpability</u>	Responsibility for a fault or wrong; blame. A level of moral culpability .
<u>defective</u>	A person with mental disabilities. A defective appliance.
delinquency	Nonpayment of a debt when due. Social causes of crime and delinquency .
<u>demonic</u>	Relating to or characteristic of demons or evil spirits. <i>Her laughter was demonic</i> .
deviltry	Wicked and cruel behavior.
diabolic	Showing the cunning or ingenuity or wickedness typical of a devil. <i>Diabolic</i> al sorcerers under the influence of devils.
<u>error</u>	A wrong action attributable to bad judgment or ignorance or inattention. <i>The crash was caused by human error.</i>
<u>hellish</u>	Very unpleasant. An unearthly hellish landscape.
immoral	Deliberately violating accepted principles of right and wrong. They considered colonialism immoral .
impious	Lacking due respect or dutifulness. <i>Impious</i> toward one s parents.
<u>improper</u>	Not in accordance with accepted standards, especially of morality or honesty. Improper medication.



inaccurate	Not accurate. An inaccurate translation.
iniquity	Immoral or grossly unfair behaviour. A den of iniquity .
<u>injustice</u>	Lack of fairness or justice. She was taken aback by the injustice of Nora s remark.
malevolence	The quality of threatening evil. <i>His eyes were glowing with malevolence</i> .
malevolent	Wishing or appearing to wish evil to others; arising from intense ill will or hatred. Failure made him malevolent toward those who were successful.
malice	Feeling a need to see others suffer. I bear no malice towards anybody.
maliciousness	Feeling a need to see others suffer.
<u>mischief</u>	Harm or trouble caused by someone or something. She ll make sure Danny doesn t get into mischief .
misinterpret	Interpret wrongly. Don t misinterpret my comments as criticism.
nefarious	(typically of an action or activity) wicked or criminal. The nefarious activities of the organized crime syndicates.
<u>spite</u>	Malevolence by virtue of being malicious or spiteful or nasty. It seemed as if the wind had a spite at her.
treacherous	Tending to betray especially having a treacherous character as attributed to the Carthaginians by the Romans. <i>Memory is particularly treacherous</i> .
ugliness	Qualities of appearance that do not give pleasure to the senses. The sheer ugliness of this architectural monstrosity.
unethical	Not conforming to approved standards of social or professional behavior. <i>Unethical business practices.</i>
<u>unjust</u>	Violating principles of justice. <i>Unjust punishment.</i>
wickedness	The quality of being wicked. The wickedness of the regime.
wrong	Treat unjustly do wrong to. The wrong side of the road.
