fell The act of felling something as a tree.

Very great; extreme. ferocious A **ferocious** battle.

The state or quality of being ferocious.

**ferocity** The **ferocity** of the storm caught them by surprise.

Extremely cruel or unpleasant. fiendish

A **fiendish** despot.

Fashionable or attractive in a bold or striking way. fierce

His **fierce** loyalty.

Extremely wicked, deeply criminal. heinous

**Heinous** accusations.



hellish Extremely difficult or unpleasant.

Hellish weather.

impious Lacking piety or reverence for a god.

The emperor s **impious** attacks on the Church.

inhumane Without compassion for misery or suffering; cruel.

Biological weapons are considered too **inhumane** to be used.

iniquitous Grossly unfair and morally wrong.

These awards remain an **iniquitous** system.

Showing a lack of respect for people or things that are generally taken

**irreverent** seriously.

A certain **irreverent** gaiety and ease of manner.

nefarious (typically of an action or activity) wicked or criminal.

**Nefarious** schemes.

extremely unpleasant; repulsive.

Consequences **odious** to those you govern.

Treat (something sacred) with irreverence or disrespect.

It was a serious matter to **profane** a tomb.

Of, on, or towards the left-hand side (in a coat of arms, from the bearer's

**sinister** point of view, i.e. the right as it is depicted).

The scheme of some **sinister** intelligence bent on punishing him.

**truculence** Obstreperous and defiant aggressiveness.

ungodly Characterized by iniquity; wicked because it is believed to be a sin.

**Ungodly** lives of lust and pleasure.

villainous Extremely bad or unpleasant.

A **villainous** smell.

wicked Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust.
