Synonyms of "Viciously" as an adverb (2 Words)

brutally In a savagely violent way.
*She was unapologetic and **brutally** honest.*

savagely In a fierce, violent, and uncontrolled manner.
*Corporations have **savagely** cut costs to boost profits.*

Usage Examples of "Viciously" as an adverb

- *He was viciously attacked.*
- *The boy swore viciously.*
- *The animals tore viciously into their flesh.*
- *A teenager was viciously attacked by a group of youths.*

barbarous	Able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering. <i>A barbarous crime.</i>
beastly	In a beastly manner. <i>This beastly war.</i>
blasphemous	Characterized by profanity or cursing. <i>Foul mouthed and blasphemous.</i>
brawl	An uproarious party. <i>A street brawl.</i>
caitiff	A contemptible or cowardly person. <i>A caitiff knight.</i>
cranky	Bad-tempered; irritable. <i>A cranky scheme to pipe ground level ozone into the stratosphere.</i>
cruel	Wilfully causing pain or suffering to others, or feeling no concern about it. <i>People who are cruel to animals.</i>
debauch	A wild gathering involving excessive drinking and promiscuity. <i>He has debauched the morals of the people and endeavoured to corrupt parliament.</i>
demonic	Extremely evil or cruel; expressive of cruelty or befitting hell. <i>A demonic hurry.</i>
despicable	Morally reprehensible. <i>Would do something as despicable as murder.</i>
diabolic	Showing the cunning or ingenuity or wickedness typical of a devil. <i>The cold calculation and diabolic art of some statesmen.</i>
fell	The act of felling something as a tree.
ferocious	Very great; extreme. <i>A ferocious battle.</i>
ferocity	The state or quality of being ferocious. <i>The ferocity of the storm caught them by surprise.</i>
fiendish	Extremely cruel or unpleasant. <i>A fiendish despot.</i>
fierce	Fashionable or attractive in a bold or striking way. <i>His fierce loyalty.</i>
heinous	Extremely wicked, deeply criminal. <i>Heinous accusations.</i>

hellish	Extremely difficult or unpleasant. <i>Hellish weather.</i>
impious	Lacking piety or reverence for a god. <i>The emperor s impious attacks on the Church.</i>
inhumane	Without compassion for misery or suffering; cruel. <i>Biological weapons are considered too inhumane to be used.</i>
iniquitous	Grossly unfair and morally wrong. <i>These awards remain an iniquitous system.</i>
irreverent	Showing a lack of respect for people or things that are generally taken seriously. <i>A certain irreverent gaiety and ease of manner.</i>
nefarious	(typically of an action or activity) wicked or criminal. <i>Nefarious schemes.</i>
odious	Extremely unpleasant; repulsive. <i>Consequences odious to those you govern.</i>
profane	Treat (something sacred) with irreverence or disrespect. <i>It was a serious matter to profane a tomb.</i>
sinister	Of, on, or towards the left-hand side (in a coat of arms, from the bearer's point of view, i.e. the right as it is depicted). <i>The scheme of some sinister intelligence bent on punishing him.</i>
truculence	Obstreperous and defiant aggressiveness.
ungodly	Characterized by iniquity; wicked because it is believed to be a sin. <i>Ungodly lives of lust and pleasure.</i>
villainous	Extremely bad or unpleasant. <i>A villainous smell.</i>
wicked	Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust. <i>Sophie makes wicked cakes.</i>
