| background | Provide with background. <i>He is a lawyer with a sports background.</i> |
| bias | Cause to be biased. <i>You are biasing my choice by telling me yours.</i> |
| bigot | A prejudiced person who is intolerant of any opinions differing from his own. <i>A racist bigot.</i> |
| cityscape | A picture of a city. <i>Shades of red brick which once coloured the cityscape.</i> |
| diorama | A miniature film set used for special effects or animation. |
| facet | A smooth surface (as of a bone or cut gemstone). <i>He studied every facet of the question.</i> |
| foreground | Move into the foreground to make more visible or prominent. <i>Sexual relationships are foregrounded and idealized.</i> |
| landscape | The genre of landscape painting. <i>The political landscape looks bleak without a change of administration.</i> |
| locale | The scene of any event or action (especially the place of a meeting). <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic locales.</i> |

| objectively | In a way that is not dependent on the mind for existence; actually. <i>Events should be reported objectively.</i> |
| objectivity | Judgment based on observable phenomena and uninfluenced by emotions or personal prejudices. <i>The piece lacked any objectivity.</i> |
| outlook | A view. <i>The deteriorating economic outlook.</i> |
| panorama | The visual percept of a region. <i>The tower offers a wonderful panorama of Prague.</i> |
| panoramic | (of a view or picture) with a wide view surrounding the observer; sweeping. <i>His panoramic vision of post World War I peace.</i> |
| personally | As yourself. <i>I went there personally.</i> |
| perspective | A particular attitude towards or way of regarding something; a point of view. <i>We must keep a sense of perspective about what he s done.</i> |
| perspicacity | Intelligence manifested by being astute (as in business dealings). <i>The perspicacity of her remarks.</i> |
| pomp | Ceremonial elegance and splendor. <i>Entertaining overseas visitors with the right degree of pomp.</i> |
| preconception | A partiality that prevents objective consideration of an issue or situation. <i>He did not even try to confirm his preconceptions.</i> |
| prepossess | To cause (a person) to be preoccupied with or by a feeling, notion, etc.; to preoccupy with or by; to imbue, inspire, or affect strongly beforehand. <i>The idea of his failure prepossesses him.</i> |
| scene | The pieces of scenery used in a play or opera. <i>A scene of carnage.</i> |
| scenery | The painted structures of a stage set that are intended to suggest a particular locale. <i>They worked all night painting the scenery.</i> |
| scenic | Providing or relating to views of impressive or beautiful natural scenery. <i>The trend to scenic figural work.</i> |
| setting | A piece of metal in which a precious stone or gem is fixed to form a piece of jewellery. <i>A romantic house in a wonderful setting beside the River Wye.</i> |
| standpoint | A mental position from which things are viewed. <i>She writes on religion from the standpoint of a believer.</i> |

values

Beliefs of a person or social group in which they have an emotional investment (either for or against something).

*He has very conservatives **values**.*

vista

A mental view of a succession of remembered or anticipated events.
