| <u>mindfulness</u> | A mental state achieved by focusing one's awareness on the present moment, while calmly acknowledging and accepting one's feelings, thoughts, and bodily sensations, used as a therapeutic technique. <i>Their mindfulness of the wider cinematic tradition.</i> | |
| prudence | Discretion in practical affairs. We need to exercise prudence in such important matters. | |
| surveillance | Close observation, especially of a suspected spy or criminal. <i>He found himself put under surveillance by British military intelligence.</i> | |
| wakefulness | A temporary state in which you are unable (or unwilling) to sleep. Accept your wakefulness and sleep in its own contrary way is more likely to come. | |
| wariness | The trait of being cautious and watchful. Her mother s wariness of computers. | |
| watchfulness | The process of paying close and continuous attention. Wakefulness watchfulness and bellicosity make a good hunter. | |
| weather eye | The atmospheric conditions that comprise the state of the atmosphere in terms of temperature and wind and clouds and precipitation. | |

| indomitable | Impossible to subdue. A woman of indomitable spirit. |
| <u>mental</u> | Of or relating to the chin or median part of the lower jaw. Mental images of happy times. |
| nursing | The work of caring for the sick or injured or infirm. This medicine has not been reported to cause problems in nursing babies. |
| <u>observe</u> | Observe with care or pay close attention to. A stockbroker once observe d that dealers live and work in hell. |
| obstinacy | Resolute adherence to your own ideas or desires. <i>His reputation for obstinacy.</i> |
| obstinate | Tenaciously unwilling or marked by tenacious unwillingness to yield. An obstinate child with a violent temper. |
| patience | Good-natured tolerance of delay or incompetence. I have run out of patience with her. |
| perseverance | Persistence in doing something despite difficulty or delay in achieving success. His perseverance with the technique illustrates his single mindedness. |
| persistence | Persistent determination. The persistence of huge environmental problems. |
| pertinacity | Persistent determination. |
| <u>refrain</u> | Choose not to consume. <i>He refrained from hitting him back.</i> |
| <u>reliance</u> | A person or thing on which someone depends. <i>He wrote the paper with considerable reliance on the work of other scientists.</i> |
| resourcefulness | The ability to deal resourcefully with unusual problems. <i>His films show remarkable technical</i> resourcefulness . |



| slapdash | Marked by great carelessness. The shelves were put up slapdash . |
