A mental state achieved by focusing one's awareness on the present moment, while calmly acknowledging and accepting one's feelings,

mindfulness thoughts, and bodily sensations, used as a therapeutic technique.

prudence Discretion in practical affairs.

We need to exercise **prudence** in such important matters.

surveillance Close observation, especially of a suspected spy or criminal.

terms of temperature and wind and clouds and precipitation.






# Usage Examples of "Vigilance" as a noun
