- A brief evocative description, account, or episode.
- A small illustrative sketch (as sometimes placed at the beginning of chapters in books.
- A photograph whose edges shade off gradually.
- A small ornamental design filling a space in a book or carving, typically based on foliage.
- A brief literary description.

<u>chronicle</u>	A factual written account of important or historical events in the order of their occurrence. A chronicle of his life during the war years.
cut	The way or style in which something especially a garment or someone s hair is cut. The cut from the accident scene to the hospital seemed too abrupt.
<u>depiction</u>	The action of depicting something, especially in a work of art. Michelangelo s depiction s of the male nude.
description	The action of giving a spoken or written account. It is laughably easy to buy drugs of all description s.
design	A decorative pattern. The design of a building.



engraving	A print made from an engraving. The quality of his engraving established new standards.
etching	A print produced by the process of etching. The artist dispensed with the medium of etching .
impression	An impressionistic portrayal of a person. The events left a permanent impression in his mind.
linocut	A print made from a linocut block.
lithograph	A print produced by lithography.
monoprint	A single print taken from a design created in oil paint or printing ink on glass or metal. She won an award of merit for her monoprint of a father and child.
<u>photo</u>	A photograph.
photograph	A picture made using a camera, in which an image is focused on to light- sensitive material and then made visible and permanent by chemical treatment, or stored digitally. A photograph of her father.
picture	A visual representation (of an object or scene or person or abstraction) produced on a surface. Draw a picture of a tree.
<u>plate</u>	The quantity contained in a plate. <i>He pushed his empty plate to one side and sipped his wine.</i>
portrayal	Acting the part of a character on stage; dramatically representing the character by speech and action and gesture. <i>His portrayal of the title character.</i>
representation	(in some theories of perception) a mental state or concept regarded as corresponding to a thing perceived. <i>The sales contract contains several</i> representation s by the vendor.
shot	A ball of stone or metal used as a missile shot from a large gun or cannon. <i>He poured a shot of whiskey.</i>
silk screen	A fabric made from the fine threads produced by certain insect larvae.
<u>sketch</u>	A short humorous play or performance, consisting typically of one scene in a revue or comedy programme. A hilarious sketch for their latest BBC series.
snap	The act of snapping the fingers movement of a finger from the tip to the base of the thumb on the same hand. <i>He can hear the snap of a twig.</i>



<u>snapshot</u>	A shot in soccer or hockey taken quickly with little backlift. My snapshot s haven t been developed yet.
still	An apparatus used for the distillation of liquids consists of a vessel in which a substance is vaporized by heat and a condenser where the vapor is condensed. <i>He wanted some stills for a magazine ad.</i>
story	A plot or storyline. The story of modern farming.
studio portrai	t An apartment with a living space and a bathroom and a small kitchen.
study	A room used for reading and writing and studying. I m a quick study .
woodcut	A print made from a woodcut.

<u>delineate</u>	Show the form or outline of. <i>His finger found a precisely outlined section</i> delineate d in red marker.
doodle	Make a doodle draw aimlessly. The text was interspersed with doodle s.
draft	Select a player for a sports team through the draft. The draft and I were sent to the barracks near Folkestone.
droll	A jester or entertainer; a buffoon. His unique brand of droll self mockery.

facetious	Cleverly amusing in tone. A facetious remark.
farcical	Relating to or resembling farce, especially because of absurd or ridiculous aspects. <i>He considered the whole idea</i> farcical .
funny	An account of an amusing incident (usually with a punch line. I do get some funny looks.
<u>hilarious</u>	Boisterously merry. <i>Hilarious</i> broad comedy.
humor	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. The humor s are blood and phlegm and yellow and black bile.
humorous	Full of or characterized by humor. A humorous and entertaining talk.
jesting	Said or done for amusement; joking. A jesting commentary on world affairs.
jocose	Playful or humorous. A jocose allusion.
jocular	With humor. They tried to deal with this painful subject jocular ly.
<u>laughable</u>	Arousing or provoking laughter. If it didn t make me so angry it would be laughable .
outline	Draw up an outline or sketch for something. Sketch the outline of the book.
precis	Make a precis of a text or speech.
profile	Represent in profile by drawing or painting. <i>He was standing motionless</i> profile <i>d on the far side of the swimming pool.</i>
repartee	Adroitness and cleverness in reply. <i>Quick fire repartee</i> .
resume	Assume anew. Resume an office.
scribble	A piece of writing or a picture produced carelessly or hurriedly. They scribble d potted and painted.



<u>sketch</u>	Make a sketch of. As they talked Modigliani began to sketch her.
skit	A short informal performance intended to educate or inform. A skit on daytime magazine programmes.
slapstick	Comedy based on deliberately clumsy actions and humorously embarrassing events. <i>Slapstick style of humor</i> .
<u>synopsis</u>	A brief summary or general survey of something. A synopsis of the insurance cover provided is set out below.
waggish	Humorous in a playful, mischievous, or facetious manner. Muskrat Castle as the house has been facetiously named by some waggish officer.
<u>witty</u>	Combining clever conception and facetious expression. A witty remark.
