- *A small illustrative sketch (as sometimes placed at the beginning of chapters in books).*
- *A photograph whose edges shade off gradually.*
- *A small ornamental design filling a space in a book or carving, typically based on foliage.*
- *A brief literary description.*

<b>account</b>	A client having an account with a supplier. <i>A detailed <b>account</b> of what has been achieved.</i>
<b><u>chronicle</u></b>	A factual written account of important or historical events in the order of their occurrence. <i>A <b>chronicle</b> of his life during the war years.</i>
<b>cut</b>	The way or style in which something especially a garment or someone's hair is cut. <i>The <b>cut</b> from the accident scene to the hospital seemed too abrupt.</i>
<b><u>depiction</u></b>	The action of depicting something, especially in a work of art. <i>Michelangelo's <b>depictions</b> of the male nude.</i>
<b>description</b>	The action of giving a spoken or written account. <i>It is laughably easy to buy drugs of all <b>descriptions</b>.</i>
<b>design</b>	A decorative pattern. <i>The <b>design</b> of a building.</i>

<b>engraving</b>	A print made from an engraving. <i>The quality of his <b>engraving</b> established new standards.</i>
<b>etching</b>	A print produced by the process of etching. <i>The artist dispensed with the medium of <b>etching</b>.</i>
<b><u>impression</u></b>	An impressionistic portrayal of a person. <i>The events left a permanent <b>impression</b> in his mind.</i>
<b>linocut</b>	A print made from a linocut block.
<b>lithograph</b>	A print produced by lithography.
<b>monoprint</b>	A single print taken from a design created in oil paint or printing ink on glass or metal. <i>She won an award of merit for her <b>monoprint</b> of a father and child.</i>
<b><u>photo</u></b>	A photograph.
<b>photograph</b>	A picture made using a camera, in which an image is focused on to light-sensitive material and then made visible and permanent by chemical treatment, or stored digitally. <i>A <b>photograph</b> of her father.</i>
<b>picture</b>	A visual representation (of an object or scene or person or abstraction) produced on a surface. <i>Draw a <b>picture</b> of a tree.</i>
<b><u>plate</u></b>	The quantity contained in a plate. <i>He pushed his empty <b>plate</b> to one side and sipped his wine.</i>
<b>portrayal</b>	Acting the part of a character on stage; dramatically representing the character by speech and action and gesture. <i>His <b>portrayal</b> of the title character.</i>
<b>representation</b>	(in some theories of perception) a mental state or concept regarded as corresponding to a thing perceived. <i>The sales contract contains several <b>representations</b> by the vendor.</i>
<b>shot</b>	A ball of stone or metal used as a missile shot from a large gun or cannon. <i>He poured a <b>shot</b> of whiskey.</i>
<b>silk screen</b>	A fabric made from the fine threads produced by certain insect larvae.
<b><u>sketch</u></b>	A short humorous play or performance, consisting typically of one scene in a revue or comedy programme. <i>A hilarious <b>sketch</b> for their latest BBC series.</i>
<b>snap</b>	The act of snapping the fingers movement of a finger from the tip to the base of the thumb on the same hand. <i>He can hear the <b>snap</b> of a twig.</i>

- snapshot** A shot in soccer or hockey taken quickly with little backlift.  
*My **snapshots** haven't been developed yet.*
- still** An apparatus used for the distillation of liquids consists of a vessel in which a substance is vaporized by heat and a condenser where the vapor is condensed.  
*He wanted some **stills** for a magazine ad.*
- story** A plot or storyline.  
*The **story** of modern farming.*
- studio portrait** An apartment with a living space and a bathroom and a small kitchen.
- study** A room used for reading and writing and studying.  
*I'm a quick **study**.*
- woodcut** A print made from a woodcut.

- delineate** Show the form or outline of.  
*His finger found a precisely outlined section **delineated** in red marker.*
- doodle** Make a doodle draw aimlessly.

- draft** Select a player for a sports team through the draft.  
*The **draft** and I were sent to the barracks near Folkestone.*
- droll** A jester or entertainer; a buffoon.  
*His unique brand of **droll** self mockery.*

<b>engraved</b>	Cut or impressed into a surface. <i>Engraved</i> invitations.
<b>exhilaration</b>	A feeling of excitement, happiness, or elation. <i>They felt the <b>exhilaration</b> of victory.</i>
<b>facetious</b>	Cleverly amusing in tone. <i>A <b>facetious</b> remark.</i>
<b>farcical</b>	Relating to or resembling farce, especially because of absurd or ridiculous aspects. <i>He considered the whole idea <b>farcical</b>.</i>
<b>funny</b>	An account of an amusing incident (usually with a punch line). <i>I do get some <b>funny</b> looks.</i>
<b>hilarious</b>	Boisterously merry. <i><b>Hilarious</b> broad comedy.</i>
<b>humor</b>	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>The <b>humors</b> are blood and phlegm and yellow and black bile.</i>
<b>humorous</b>	Full of or characterized by humor. <i>A <b>humorous</b> and entertaining talk.</i>
<b>jesting</b>	Said or done for amusement; joking. <i>A <b>jesting</b> commentary on world affairs.</i>
<b>jocose</b>	Playful or humorous. <i>A <b>jocose</b> allusion.</i>
<b>jocular</b>	With humor. <i>They tried to deal with this painful subject <b>jocularly</b>.</i>
<b>laughable</b>	Arousing or provoking laughter. <i>If it didn't make me so angry it would be <b>laughable</b>.</i>
<b>outline</b>	Draw up an outline or sketch for something. <i>Sketch the <b>outline</b> of the book.</i>
<b>precis</b>	Make a precis of a text or speech.
<b>profile</b>	Represent in profile by drawing or painting. <i>He was standing motionless <b>profiled</b> on the far side of the swimming pool.</i>
<b>repartee</b>	Adroitness and cleverness in reply. <i>Quick fire <b>repartee</b>.</i>
<b>resume</b>	Assume anew. <i><b>Resume</b> an office.</i>
<b>scribble</b>	A piece of writing or a picture produced carelessly or hurriedly. <i>They <b>scribbled</b> potted and painted.</i>

*As they talked Modigliani began to **sketch** her.*
- skit** A short informal performance intended to educate or inform.  
*A **skit** on daytime magazine programmes.*
- slapstick** Comedy based on deliberately clumsy actions and humorously embarrassing events.  
***Slapstick** style of humor.*
- synopsis** A brief summary or general survey of something.  
*A **synopsis** of the insurance cover provided is set out below.*
- waggish** Humorous in a playful, mischievous, or facetious manner.  
*Muskrat Castle as the house has been facetiously named by some **waggish** officer.*
- witty** Combining clever conception and facetious expression.  
*A **witty** remark.*
