<b>fit</b>	Having the requisite qualities or skills to undertake something competently. <i>Do as you see <b>fit</b> to.</i>
<b>forceful</b>	Forceful and definite in expression or action. <i>A <b>forceful</b> personality.</i>
<b>forcible</b>	Vigorous and strong; forceful. <i>They could only be deterred by <b>forcible</b> appeals.</i>
<b>hale and hearty</b>	Exhibiting or restored to vigorous good health.
<b>healthy</b>	Normal, natural, and desirable. <i>The <b>healthy</b> attitude of French laws.</i>
<b>in good condition</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>in good health</b>	Holding office.
<b>in good kilter</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>in good shape</b>	Directed or bound inward.
<b>in good trim</b>	Holding office.
<b>in tip-top condition</b>	Holding office.
<b>intense</b>	Extremely sharp or intense. <i><b>Intense</b> anxiety.</i>
<b><u>intensive</u></b>	(of agriculture) aiming to achieve maximum production within a limited area, especially by using chemical and technological aids. <i>A labor <b>intensive</b> industry.</i>
<b>keen</b>	Interested in or attracted by (someone or something). <i>I have <b>keen</b> eyesight.</i>
<b>mettlesome</b>	Willing to face danger. <i>Their horses were beasts of burden not <b>mettlesome</b> chargers.</i>
<b>passionate</b>	Arising from intense feelings of sexual love. <i>A <b>passionate</b> kiss.</i>

<b>potent</b>	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>Providing the ground soldier with increasingly <b>potent</b> weapons.</i>
<b>powerful</b>	Possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i>The most <b>powerful</b> government in western Europe.</i>
<u><b>resolute</b></u>	Firm in purpose or belief; characterized by firmness and determination. <i>Stood <b>resolute</b> against the enemy.</i>
<b>robust</b>	(of wine or food) strong and rich in flavour or smell. <i>A <b>robust</b> metal cabinet.</i>
<u><b>spirited</b></u>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A <b>spirited</b> dance.</i>
<b>strenuous</b>	Taxing to the utmost; testing powers of endurance. <i>The government made <b>strenuous</b> efforts to upgrade the quality of the teaching profession.</i>
<b>strong</b>	Relating to or denoting the strongest of the known kinds of force between particles which acts between nucleons and other hadrons when closer than about 10 cm so binding protons in a nucleus despite the repulsion due to their charge and which conserves strangeness parity and isospin. <i>Sing is a <b>strong</b> verb.</i>
<b>strong as an horse</b>	Strong and sure.
<b>strong as an lion</b>	Of verbs not having standard (or regular) inflection.
<b>strong as an ox</b>	Of good quality and condition; solidly built.
<u><b>sturdy</b></u>	(of a person or their body) strongly and solidly built. <i>The townspeople have a <b>sturdy</b> independence.</i>
<u><b>unbridled</b></u>	Not restrained or controlled. <i>A moment of <b>unbridled</b> ambition.</i>
<u><b>uncontrolled</b></u>	Not being under control; out of control. <i>Some <b>uncontrolled</b> children rather marred the proceedings.</i>
<u><b>unrestrained</b></u>	Marked by uncontrolled excitement or emotion. <i><b>Unrestrained</b> laughter.</i>
<u><b>vehement</b></u>	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions; inclined to react violently; fervid. <i>Her voice was low but <b>vehement</b>.</i>
<b>wild</b>	Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation. <i>Her <b>wild</b> eyes were darting back and forth.</i>

zealous

Having or showing zeal.

*The council was extremely **zealous** in the application of the regulations.*

<b><u>stalwart</u></b>	Having rugged physical strength; inured to fatigue or hardships. <i>He remained a <b>stalwart</b> supporter of the cause.</i>
<b><u>stout</u></b>	(of a person) rather fat or of heavy build. <i>There is a tradition in England of drinking <b>stout</b> while eating oysters.</i>
<b>strenuous</b>	Taxing to the utmost; testing powers of endurance. <i>A <b>strenuous</b> task.</i>
<b>striving</b>	An effortful attempt to attain a goal.
<b>strong</b>	Relating to or denoting the strongest of the known kinds of force between particles which acts between nucleons and other hadrons when closer than about 10 cm so binding protons in a nucleus despite the repulsion due to their charge and which conserves strangeness parity and isospin. <i>Driving on these motorways requires <b>strong</b> nerves.</i>
<b><u>sturdy</u></b>	Substantially made or constructed. <i>He had a <b>sturdy</b> muscular physique.</i>
<b><u>tireless</u></b>	Characterized by hard work and perseverance. <i>A <b>tireless</b> campaigner.</i>
<b><u>tough</u></b>	Physically toughened. <i>Poor kid It s <b>tough</b> on her.</i>
<b>unflagging</b>	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>His apparently <b>unflagging</b> enthusiasm impressed her.</i>
<b>unflinching</b>	Not showing fear or hesitation in the face of danger or difficulty. <i>He has shown <b>unflinching</b> determination throughout the campaign.</i>
