hale and hearty	Exhibiting or restored to vigorous good health.
healthy	Normal, natural, and desirable. <i>The healthy attitude of French laws.</i>
in good condition	Currently fashionable.
in good health	Holding office.
in good kilter	Currently fashionable.
in good shape	Directed or bound inward.
in good trim	Holding office.
in tip-top condition	Holding office.
intense	Extremely sharp or intense. <i>Intense anxiety.</i>
intensive	(of agriculture) aiming to achieve maximum production within a limited area, especially by using chemical and technological aids. <i>A labor intensive industry.</i>
keen	Interested in or attracted by (someone or something). <i>I have keen eyesight.</i>
mettlesome	Willing to face danger. <i>Their horses were beasts of burden not mettlesome chargers.</i>
passionate	Arising from intense feelings of sexual love. <i>A passionate kiss.</i>

potent	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>Providing the ground soldier with increasingly potent weapons.</i>
powerful	Possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i>The most powerful government in western Europe.</i>
<u>resolute</u>	Firm in purpose or belief; characterized by firmness and determination. <i>Stood resolute against the enemy.</i>
robust	(of wine or food) strong and rich in flavour or smell. <i>A robust metal cabinet.</i>
<u>spirited</u>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A spirited dance.</i>
strenuous	Taxing to the utmost; testing powers of endurance. <i>The government made strenuous efforts to upgrade the quality of the teaching profession.</i>
strong	Relating to or denoting the strongest of the known kinds of force between particles which acts between nucleons and other hadrons when closer than about 10 cm so binding protons in a nucleus despite the repulsion due to their charge and which conserves strangeness parity and isospin. <i>Sing is a strong verb.</i>
strong as an horse	Strong and sure.
strong as an lion	Of verbs not having standard (or regular) inflection.
strong as an ox	Of good quality and condition; solidly built.
<u>sturdy</u>	(of a person or their body) strongly and solidly built. <i>The townspeople have a sturdy independence.</i>
<u>unbridled</u>	Not restrained or controlled. <i>A moment of unbridled ambition.</i>
<u>uncontrolled</u>	Not being under control; out of control. <i>Some uncontrolled children rather marred the proceedings.</i>
<u>unrestrained</u>	Marked by uncontrolled excitement or emotion. <i>Unrestrained laughter.</i>
<u>vehement</u>	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions; inclined to react violently; fervid. <i>Her voice was low but vehement.</i>
wild	Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation. <i>Her wild eyes were darting back and forth.</i>

zealous

Having or showing zeal.

*The council was extremely **zealous** in the application of the regulations.*

<u>brave</u>	People who are brave. <i>She braved the elements.</i>
burly	(of a person) large and strong; heavily built. <i>I saw a burly figure approaching.</i>
cheerily	In a happy and optimistic way. <i>He chats cheerily about city living.</i>
<u>daredevil</u>	Reckless and daring. <i>Spectators watched in horror as the nineteen year old daredevil smashed into the ground.</i>
dauntless	Showing fearlessness and determination. <i>Dauntless bravery.</i>
<u>driven</u>	(of snow) piled into drifts or made smooth by the wind. <i>Wind driven sand.</i>

<u>fervent</u>	Characterized by intense emotion. <i>A fervent supporter of the revolution.</i>
hard	Causing great damage or hardship. <i>They work hard at school.</i>
hardy	Able to survive under unfavorable weather conditions. <i>Hardy explorers of northern Canada.</i>
husky	Breed of heavy-coated Arctic sled dog. <i>Paddy looked a husky strong guy.</i>
indefatigable	(of a person or their efforts) persisting tirelessly. <i>An indefatigable defender of human rights.</i>
<u>intrepid</u>	Fearless; adventurous (often used for rhetorical or humorous effect). <i>Intrepid pioneers.</i>

robust	(of a system, organization, etc.) able to withstand or overcome adverse conditions. <i>A robust faith.</i>
stalwart	Having rugged physical strength; inured to fatigue or hardships. <i>He remained a stalwart supporter of the cause.</i>
stout	(of a person) rather fat or of heavy build. <i>There is a tradition in England of drinking stout while eating oysters.</i>
strenuous	Taxing to the utmost; testing powers of endurance. <i>A strenuous task.</i>
striving	An effortful attempt to attain a goal.
strong	Relating to or denoting the strongest of the known kinds of force between particles which acts between nucleons and other hadrons when closer than about 10 cm so binding protons in a nucleus despite the repulsion due to their charge and which conserves strangeness parity and isospin. <i>Driving on these motorways requires strong nerves.</i>
sturdy	Substantially made or constructed. <i>He had a sturdy muscular physique.</i>
tireless	Characterized by hard work and perseverance. <i>A tireless campaigner.</i>
tough	Physically toughened. <i>Poor kid It s tough on her.</i>
unflagging	Showing sustained enthusiastic action with unflagging vitality. <i>His apparently unflagging enthusiasm impressed her.</i>
unflinching	Not showing fear or hesitation in the face of danger or difficulty. <i>He has shown unflinching determination throughout the campaign.</i>
virile	(of a male) capable of copulation. <i>A strong virile performance of the Mass.</i>
