Definitions of "Villa" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “villa” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A large country house of Roman times, having an estate and consisting of farm and residential buildings arranged around a courtyard.*
- *A detached or semi-detached house in a residential district, typically one that is Victorian or Edwardian in style.*
- *Pretentious and luxurious country residence with extensive grounds.*
- *A rented holiday home abroad.*
- *(especially in continental Europe) a large and luxurious country house in its own grounds.*
- *Mexican revolutionary leader (1877-1923).*
- *Country house in ancient Rome consisting of residential quarters and farm buildings around a courtyard.*
- *Detached or semidetached suburban house.*



Synonyms of "Villa" as a noun (19 Words)

- abode** Residence.
*My humble **abode**.*
- bungalow** A low house having only one storey or, in some cases, upper rooms set in the roof, typically with dormer windows.
- cabin** A private room or compartment on a ship.
*The **cabin** lay three miles into the reserve.*
- castle** A large building, typically of the medieval period, fortified against attack with thick walls, battlements, towers, and in many cases a moat.
*The crumbling stonework of a ruined **castle**.*
- chalet** A Swiss house with a sloping roof and wide eaves or a house built in this style.
- country house** An area outside of cities and towns.
- doroteo arango** Mexican revolutionary leader (1877-1923).

| residence | Any address at which you dwell more than temporarily. <i>The palace was designated the official residence of the head of state.</i> |
| seat | A part of a machine that supports or guides another part. <i>Parliament House was the seat of the Scots Parliament until the Union with England.</i> |
| shack | Small crude shelter used as a dwelling. |
| shanty | A rhythmical work song originally sung by sailors. |
| small house | The slender part of the back. |
