Synonyms of "Villainy" as a noun (27 Words)

badness	Used of the degree of something undesirable e.g. pain or weather. <i>The concepts of goodness and badness.</i>
baseness	Unworthiness by virtue of lacking higher values. <i>The baseness of human nature.</i>
degeneracy	The state of being degenerate in mental or moral qualities. <i>Moral degeneracy followed intellectual degeneration.</i>
delinquency	Minor crime, especially that committed by young people. <i>Social causes of crime and delinquency.</i>

depravity	Moral corruption; wickedness. <i>Its brothels its opium parlors its depravity.</i>
devilry	Wicked and cruel behavior. <i>Some spirit of devilry made me go on teasing her.</i>
disgrace	Loss of reputation or respect as the result of a dishonourable action. <i>He left the army in disgrace.</i>
dishonesty	Lack of honesty; acts of lying or cheating or stealing. <i>The dismissal of thirty civil servants for dishonesty and misconduct.</i>
dissipation	Overindulgence in sensual pleasures; dissipated living. <i>A descent into drunkenness and sexual dissipation.</i>
dissolution	The action or process of dissolving or being dissolved. <i>The Prime Minister asked the queen for a dissolution of Parliament.</i>
double-dealing	Acting in bad faith; deception by pretending to entertain one set of intentions while acting under the influence of another.
evil	The quality of being morally wrong in principle or practice. <i>The various social evils of our modern world.</i>
heinousness	The quality of being shockingly cruel and inhumane.
immorality	The state or quality of being immoral; wickedness. <i>He believed his father had been punished by God for his immorality.</i>
iniquity	Morally objectionable behavior. <i>A den of iniquity.</i>
rascality	The trait of indulging in disreputable pranks. <i>The investigation uncovered his rascality.</i>
roguery	Reckless or malicious behavior that causes discomfort or annoyance in others. <i>There has always been roguery associated with horse dealing.</i>
sin	Violent and excited activity. <i>He committed the unforgivable sin of refusing to give interviews.</i>
sinfulness	Estrangement from god.
turpitude	Depraved or wicked behaviour or character. <i>Acts of moral turpitude.</i>
unscrupulousness	The quality of unscrupulous dishonesty.
viciousness	Aggressive, angry behaviour. <i>She was visibly shocked by the viciousness of the attack.</i>
vileness	The quality of being wicked. <i>The vileness of his language surprised us.</i>
villainousness	The quality of evil by virtue of villainous behavior.

wickedness	Absence of moral or spiritual values. <i>The wickedness of the regime.</i>
wrong	That which is contrary to the principles of justice or law. <i>He feels that you are in the wrong.</i>
wrongdoing	Departure from what is ethically acceptable. <i>He denied any wrongdoing.</i>
