badness Used of the degree of something undesirable e.g. pain or weather.

baseness Unworthiness by virtue of lacking higher values.

The **baseness** of human nature.

degeneracyThe state of being degenerate in mental or moral qualities.

Moral **degeneracy** followed intellectual degeneration.

delinquencyMinor crime, especially that committed by young people.

Social causes of crime and delinquency.



depravity Moral corruption; wickedness.

Its brothels its opium parlors its **depravity**.

devilry Wicked and cruel behavior.

Some spirit of **devilry** made me go on teasing her.

disgrace Loss of reputation or respect as the result of a dishonourable action.

He left the army in disgrace.

dishonestyLack of honesty; acts of lying or cheating or stealing.

The dismissal of thirty civil servants for **dishonesty** and misconduct.

dissipation

Overindulgence in sensual pleasures; dissipated living.

A descent into drunkenness and sexual dissipation.

The action or process of dissolving or being dissolved.

The Prime Minister asked the queen for a **dissolution** of Parliament.

double-dealingActing in bad faith; deception by pretending to entertain one set of

intentions while acting under the influence of another.

The quality of being morally wrong in principle or practice.

The various social **evil**s of our modern world.

heinousness The quality of being shockingly cruel and inhumane.

immoralityThe state or quality of being immoral; wickedness.

He believed his father had been punished by God for his **immorality**.

iniquity Morally objectionable behavior.

A den of **iniquity**.

rascalityThe trait of indulging in disreputable pranks.

The investigation uncovered his **rascality**.

Reckless or malicious behavior that causes discomfort or annoyance in

roguery others.

evil

There has always been **roguery** associated with horse dealing.

Violent and excited activity.

He committed the unforgivable **sin** of refu**sin**g to give interviews.

sinfulness Estrangement from god.

turpitude Depraved or wicked behaviour or character.

Acts of moral **turpitude**.

unscrupulousness The quality of unscrupulous dishonesty.

viciousness Aggressive, angry behaviour.

She was visibly shocked by the viciousness of the attack.

vileness The quality of being wicked.

The **vileness** of his language surprised us.

villainousness The quality of evil by virtue of villainous behavior.



wickedness Absence of moral or spiritual values.

The **wickedness** of the regime.

wrong

That which is contrary to the principles of justice or law.

He feels that you are in the **wrong**.

wrongdoing

Departure from what is ethically acceptable.

He depied any wrongdoing

He denied any **wrongdoing**.
