<u>alacrity</u>	Liveliness and eagerness. <i>He accepted with <b>alacrity</b>.</i>
ardor	Intense feeling of love. They were imbued with a revolutionary <b>ardor</b> .
eager	Strongly wanting to do or have something. Small <b>eager</b> faces looked up and listened.
eagerness	Enthusiasm to do or to have something; keenness. The player showed <b>eagerness</b> to play.

enthusiastic	Having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. <i>Enthusiastic crowds filled the streets.</i>
fervid	Intensely enthusiastic or passionate, especially to an excessive degree. <i>His fervid</i> protestations of love.
<u>fervor</u>	The state of being emotionally aroused and worked up.
fever	A rise in the temperature of the body; frequently a symptom of infection. <i>She had a slight fever.</i>
flog	Beat severely with a whip or rod. The issue has been <b>flog</b> ged to death already.
<u>gusto</u>	A relish or liking. He had a particular <b>gusto</b> for those sort of performances.
<u>harass</u>	Make repeated small-scale attacks on (an enemy. The squadron s task was to <b>harass</b> the retreating enemy forces.
<u>heated</u>	Made warm or hot het is a dialectal variant of heated. A <b>heated</b> argument.
importunate	Persistent, especially to the point of annoyance. <i>Importunate</i> creditors.



importune	Approach (someone) to request or offer sexual services, especially as a prostitute. The president would <b>importune</b> them to try harder.
<u>insist</u>	Be emphatic or resolute and refuse to budge. <i>He <b>insist</b>ed on answers to his allegations.</i>
instinctively	As a matter of instinct. Some people know <b>instinctively</b> what suits them.
intensely	With extreme effort or attention. She loved him <b>intensely</b> .
irrepressible	Impossible to repress or control. An <b>irrepressible</b> rogue.
lash	An eyelash. He <b>lash</b> ed the flag to the mast.
passion	The suffering of Jesus at the Crucifixion. She nurses a <b>passion</b> for Thomas.
persistently	In a persistent manner. Prices have remained <b>persistently</b> high.
strap	Sharpen with a strap. I expected when my dad walked in that he d <b>strap</b> him.
torrid	Very hot and dry. <i>The world s most <b>torrid</b> economies.</i>
vigorously	With vigor; in a vigorous manner. <i>He defended his ideas <b>vigorously</b>.</i>
whip	Beat severely with a whip or rod. She began <b>whip</b> ping narrow lace along the top of the garment.
zeal	Prompt willingness. <i>His <b>zeal</b> for privatization.</i>
zealot	A person who is fanatical and uncompromising in pursuit of their religious, political, or other ideals.
zealotry	Excessive intolerance of opposing views. <i>He expressed concern about religious</i> <b>zealotry</b> <i>playing an increasing role in politics.</i>
zest	Vigorous and enthusiastic enjoyment. She had a great <b>zest</b> for life.
