<u>gusto</u>	A relish or liking. He had a particular gusto for those sort of performances.
<u>harass</u>	Make repeated small-scale attacks on (an enemy. The squadron s task was to harass the retreating enemy forces.
<u>heated</u>	Made warm or hot het is a dialectal variant of heated. A heated argument.
importunate	Persistent, especially to the point of annoyance. <i>Importunate</i> creditors.



importune	Approach (someone) to request or offer sexual services, especially as a prostitute. The president would importune them to try harder.
<u>insist</u>	Be emphatic or resolute and refuse to budge. <i>He insisted on answers to his allegations.</i>
instinctively	As a matter of instinct. Some people know instinctively what suits them.
intensely	With extreme effort or attention. She loved him intensely .
irrepressible	Impossible to repress or control. An irrepressible rogue.
lash	An eyelash. He lash ed the flag to the mast.
passion	The suffering of Jesus at the Crucifixion. She nurses a passion for Thomas.
persistently	In a persistent manner. Prices have remained persistently high.
strap	Sharpen with a strap. I expected when my dad walked in that he d strap him.
torrid	Very hot and dry. <i>The world s most torrid economies.</i>
vigorously	With vigor; in a vigorous manner. <i>He defended his ideas vigorously.</i>
whip	Beat severely with a whip or rod. She began whip ping narrow lace along the top of the garment.
zeal	Prompt willingness. <i>His zeal for privatization.</i>
zealot	A person who is fanatical and uncompromising in pursuit of their religious, political, or other ideals.
zealotry	Excessive intolerance of opposing views. <i>He expressed concern about religious</i> zealotry <i>playing an increasing role in politics.</i>
zest	Vigorous and enthusiastic enjoyment. She had a great zest for life.
