- *The masculine property of being capable of copulation and procreation.*



Synonyms of "Virility" as a noun (18 Words)

boldness	Willingness to take risks and act innovatively; confidence or courage. <i>They had the boldness to mock a man who had served his country.</i>
bravery	Feeling no fear. <i>Perhaps I ll get a medal for bravery.</i>
<u>chivalry</u>	The combination of qualities expected of an ideal knight, namely courage, honour, courtesy, justice, and a readiness to help the weak. <i>The age of chivalry.</i>
daring	The trait of being willing to undertake things that involve risk or danger. <i>The daring of the players brings fortune or ruin.</i>
fearlessness	The trait of feeling no fear. <i>She quickly earned a reputation for fearlessness.</i>
gallantry	Courtesy towards women. <i>No young man offers to carry this burden for her such gallantry is out of fashion.</i>

heroism	The qualities of a hero or heroine; exceptional or heroic courage when facing danger (especially in battle). <i>They fought with exemplary heroism.</i>
intrepidity	Resolute courageousness.
machismo	Exaggerated masculinity. <i>The exaggerated machismo displayed in the tango.</i>
maleness	An animal that produces gametes (spermatozoa) that can fertilize female gametes (ova).
manfulness	The trait of being manly; having the characteristics of an adult male.
manhood	The qualities traditionally associated with men, such as courage, strength, and sexual potency. <i>He feared the speedy decline of all manhood.</i>
manliness	The traditional male quality of being brave and strong. <i>The author's alleged lack of manliness.</i>
masculinity	Qualities or attributes regarded as characteristic of men. <i>Handsome muscled and driven he's a prime example of masculinity.</i>
mettle	The courage to carry on. <i>The team showed their true mettle in the second half.</i>
spirit	The intended meaning of a communication. <i>As I sat alone in that corridor my spirits were low.</i>
valiance	Great courage or determination. <i>He is expected to demonstrate great courage and valiance in battles.</i>
valour	The qualities of a hero or heroine; exceptional or heroic courage when facing danger (especially in battle). <i>The medals are awarded for acts of valour.</i>

audacity	Rude or disrespectful behaviour; impudence. <i>She had the audacity to suggest I d been carrying on with him.</i>
bold	A bold typeface or letter. <i>A bold attempt to solve the crisis.</i>
boldness	Confidence to an impudent or presumptuous degree. <i>The boldness and independence that characterized his leadership.</i>
brave	People who are brave. <i>These six men braved the rough seas.</i>
bravery	Feeling no fear. <i>Perhaps I ll get a medal for bravery.</i>

courage	A quality of spirit that enables you to face danger or pain without showing fear. <i>She called on all her courage to face the ordeal.</i>
daring	Causing outrage or surprise by being boldly unconventional. <i>A daring crime.</i>
fertility	The state of being fertile; capable of producing offspring. <i>Anxiety and stress affect fertility in both men and women.</i>
fortitude	Strength of mind that enables one to endure adversity with courage. <i>She endured her illness with great fortitude.</i>
<u>gall</u>	A digestive juice secreted by the liver and stored in the gallbladder aids in the digestion of fats. <i>It galls me that we lost the suit.</i>
<u>hero</u>	The principal character in a play or movie or novel or poem. <i>The hero of the range is the daily face peel.</i>
male	A male person a man or boy. <i>The male lead.</i>
manliness	The traditional male quality of being brave and strong. <i>Men accustomed to proving their manliness on the streets.</i>
<u>manly</u>	Possessing qualities befitting a man. <i>A manly torso of perfect proportions.</i>
<u>masculine</u>	A masculine word or form. <i>A masculine cadence.</i>
mettle	The courage to carry on. <i>The team showed their true mettle in the second half.</i>
<u>muscular</u>	Having a robust muscular body build characterized by predominance of structures bone and muscle and connective tissue developed from the embryonic mesodermal layer. <i>His legs were strong and muscular.</i>
potent	Having great influence. <i>Providing the ground soldier with increasingly potent weapons.</i>
resourcefulness	The ability to find quick and clever ways to overcome difficulties. <i>His films show remarkable technical resourcefulness.</i>
robust	(of wine or food) strong and rich in flavour or smell. <i>A robust tale.</i>
<u>stalwart</u>	Strongly built and sturdy. <i>A stalwart supporter of the UN.</i>

<u>stamina</u>	The ability to sustain prolonged physical or mental effort. <i>Their secret is stamina rather than speed.</i>
stouthearted	Used especially of persons. <i>A stouthearted fellow who had an active career in the army.</i>
<u>tough</u>	Feeling physical discomfort or pain tough is occasionally used colloquially for bad. <i>A tough all weather fabric.</i>
unflinching	Not showing fear or hesitation in the face of danger or difficulty. <i>He has shown unflinching determination throughout the campaign.</i>
<u>valiant</u>	Having or showing valor. <i>A valiant warrior.</i>
<u>valor</u>	The qualities of a hero or heroine; exceptional or heroic courage when facing danger (especially in battle). <i>He received a medal for valor.</i>
valorous	Having or showing valor. <i>Valorous deeds on the field of honour.</i>
<u>virile</u>	Having strength, energy, and a strong sex drive (typically used of a man). <i>He was a powerful virile man.</i>
