## Associations of "Virtues" (30 Words)

<a href="#">applaud</a>	Clap one's hands or shout after performances to indicate approval. <i>His speech was loudly <b>applauded</b>.</i>
<a href="#">chivalry</a>	The medieval principles governing knighthood and knightly conduct. <i>Tales of <b>chivalry</b> and knightly deeds.</i>
<a href="#">compliment</a>	Formal greetings, especially when sent as a message. <i>Carry my <b>compliments</b> to your kinsmen.</i>
<b>encomium</b>	A formal expression of praise.
<b>eulogistic</b>	Formally expressing praise.
<b>eulogize</b>	Praise highly in speech or writing. <i>He was <b>eulogized</b> as a rock star.</i>
<a href="#">eulogy</a>	A speech or piece of writing that praises someone or something highly, especially a tribute to someone who has just died. <i>A <b>eulogy</b> to the Queen Mother.</i>
<b>euphonious</b>	Having a pleasant sound. <i>A stream of fine <b>euphonious</b> phrases.</i>
<a href="#">exemplar</a>	Something to be imitated. <i>The place is an <b>exemplar</b> of multicultural Britain.</i>
<a href="#">extol</a>	Praise, glorify, or honor. <i>He <b>extolled</b> the virtues of the Russian peoples.</i>
<b>glorify</b>	Praise glorify or honor. <i>You are <b>glorifying</b> a rather mediocre building.</i>
<b>humble</b>	Used of unskilled work (especially domestic work). <i>Essentially <b>humble</b> and self effacing he achieved the highest formal honors and distinctions.</i>
<b>humbleness</b>	A humble feeling.
<b>humility</b>	A humble feeling. <i>He was filled with <b>humility</b> at the sight of the Pope.</i>

<b>laud</b>	Praise (a person or their achievements) highly. <i>All glory <b>laud</b> and honour to Thee Redeemer King.</i>
<b>lowliness</b>	A position of inferior status; low in station or rank or fortune or estimation.
<b>lowly</b>	To a low degree; in a low manner. <i>A <b>lowly</b> parish priest.</i>
<b>meekness</b>	The fact or condition of being meek; submissiveness. <i>All his best friends make fun of him for his <b>meekness</b>.</i>
<b>menial</b>	A person with a menial job. <i><b>Menial</b> factory jobs.</i>
<b>moderate</b>	A person who holds moderate views especially in politics. <i><b>Moderate</b> prices.</i>
<b>modest</b>	Not offensive to sexual mores in conduct or appearance. <i>A <b>modest</b> flat in Fulham.</i>
<b>modesty</b>	Formality and propriety of manner. <i><b>Modesty</b> forbade her to undress in front of so many people.</i>
<b>monument</b>	An enduring and memorable example of something. <i>A handsome <b>monument</b> of granite is placed over the grave.</i>
<b>nice</b>	Excessively fastidious and easily disgusted. <i>A <b>nice</b> point.</i>
<b>oration</b>	The style or manner in which an oration is given. <i>There is nothing quite like his messianic <b>oration</b>.</i>
<b>paeon</b>	(ancient Greece) a hymn of praise (especially one sung in ancient Greece to invoke or thank a deity). <i>He s created a filmic <b>paeon</b> to his hero.</i>
<b>panegyric</b>	A formal expression of praise. <i>A <b>panegyric</b> on the pleasures of malt whisky.</i>
<b>polite</b>	Marked by refinement in taste and manners. <i>They thought she was wrong but were too <b>polite</b> to say so.</i>
<b>tribute</b>	An act, statement, or gift that is intended to show gratitude, respect, or admiration. <i>A <b>tribute</b> show.</i>
<b>unbelievably</b>	To a great degree; extremely. <i><b>Unbelievably</b> all this is yours for 50p.</i>
