abstinent	Self-restraining; not indulging an appetite especially for food or drink. <i>Not totally abstinent but abstemious.</i>
blameless	Innocent of wrongdoing. <i>He led a blameless life.</i>
celibate	Abstaining from sexual intercourse. <i>A celibate priest.</i>

<u>chaste</u>	Abstaining from extramarital, or from all, sexual intercourse. <i>A chaste border of conventionalized flowers.</i>
clean	Ritually clean or pure. <i>Keep the wound clean.</i>
<u>ethical</u>	Adhering to ethical and moral principles. <i>An expert on ethical investment.</i>
<u>exemplary</u>	(of damages) exceeding the amount needed for simple compensation. <i>Exemplary behavior.</i>
good	Giving pleasure; enjoyable or satisfying. <i>She speaks good English.</i>
guiltless	Having no guilt; innocent. <i>People are forever criticizing the service and I am not myself guiltless in this.</i>
high-minded	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks.
<u>honest</u>	Without pretensions. <i>My honest opinion.</i>
honourable	Deserving of esteem and respect. <i>This is the only honourable course.</i>
incorruptible	Incapable of being morally corrupted. <i>Incorruptible judges are the backbone of the society.</i>
<u>irreproachable</u>	Free of guilt; not subject to blame. <i>His private life was irreproachable.</i>
<u>just</u>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>We all get our just deserts.</i>
law-abiding	Adhering strictly to laws and rules and customs.
<u>lawful</u>	Of a child born within a lawful marriage. <i>Lawful methods of dissent.</i>
maidenly	Befitting or characteristic of a maiden. <i>Maidenly modesty.</i>
moral	Holding or manifesting high principles for proper conduct. <i>A moral lesson.</i>
principled	Based on or manifesting objectively defined standards of rightness or morality. <i>Principled pragmatism and unprincipled expediency.</i>
<u>pure</u>	Of color being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i>Pure folly.</i>

right-minded	Disposed toward or having views based on what is right- Bertrand Russell.
righteous	Characterized by or proceeding from accepted standards of morality or justice. <i>Righteous indignation.</i>
unbriable	(of a person) not susceptible to bribery.
unimpeachable	Beyond doubt or reproach. <i>An unimpeachable reputation.</i>
upright	Upright in position or posture. <i>An upright and respectable man.</i>
upstanding	Meriting respect or esteem. <i>Upstanding feathered plumes.</i>
vestal	Relating to the Roman goddess Vesta. <i>A vestal temple.</i>
virginal	Being, relating to, or appropriate for a virgin. <i>Nor is there anything more virginal than the shimmer of young foliage.</i>

Usage Examples of "Virtuous" as an adjective

- *She considered herself very virtuous because she neither drank nor smoked.*

acquit	Free (someone) from a criminal charge by a verdict of not guilty. <i>She was acquitted on all counts.</i>
blameless	Innocent of wrongdoing. <i>Has lived a blameless life.</i>
chaste	Without unnecessary ornamentation; simple or restrained. <i>A chaste consoling embrace.</i>
cherub	A representation of a cherub in Western art depicted as a chubby healthy looking child with wings. <i>A wistful cherub of eighteen months photographed at her playgroup.</i>
clean	Clean and tidy up the house. <i>The trees were cleaned of apples by the storm.</i>
ethical	Adhering to ethical and moral principles. <i>All types of drugs including ethical drugs and over the counter pharmaceuticals.</i>

<u>flawless</u>	Without any imperfections or defects; perfect. <i>Her smooth flawless skin.</i>
guiltless	Free from evil or guilt. <i>People are forever criticizing the service and I am not myself guiltless in this.</i>
<u>harmless</u>	Inoffensive. <i>The venom of most spiders is harmless to humans.</i>
<u>immaculate</u>	Free from flaws or mistakes; perfect. <i>Timing and technique were immaculate.</i>
impeccable	Not capable of sin. <i>He had impeccable manners.</i>
innocence	Lack of guile or corruption; purity. <i>They must prove their innocence.</i>
innocent	Lacking sense or awareness. <i>A child s innocent stare.</i>
innocuous	Not causing disapproval. <i>It was an innocuous question.</i>
inoffensive	Not causing anger or annoyance. <i>Inoffensive behavior.</i>
<u>irreproachable</u>	Free of guilt; not subject to blame. <i>His private life was irreproachable.</i>
<u>perfection</u>	The act of making something perfect. <i>Among the key tasks was the perfection of new mechanisms of economic management.</i>
<u>pristine</u>	Completely free from dirt or contamination. <i>A pristine white shirt.</i>
<u>pure</u>	Being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i>80 pure bred stallions were on parade.</i>
<u>purity</u>	A woman's virtue or chastity. <i>White roses represent purity and innocence.</i>
<u>righteous</u>	Very good; excellent. <i>Feelings of righteous indignation about pay and conditions.</i>
<u>sheer</u>	Cause to sheer. <i>Sheer silk stockings.</i>
sinless	Free from sin. <i>The sinless life of Christ.</i>

unblemished	Not damaged or marked in any way. <i>An unblemished complexion.</i>
unexceptionable	Completely acceptable; not open to exception or reproach. <i>The unexceptionable belief that society should be governed by law.</i>
unimpeachable	Not able to be doubted, questioned, or criticized; entirely trustworthy. <i>An unimpeachable witness.</i>
unmixed	Not mixed. <i>Bold unmixed colours.</i>
unspotted	Unnoticed. <i>It has an unspotted white throat.</i>
unsullied	Free from blemishes. <i>His unsullied name.</i>
<u>untainted</u>	Not contaminated, polluted, or tainted. <i>The island remains virtually untainted by commercialism.</i>
