### Synonyms of "Virtuous" as an adjective (30 Words)

<b>abstinent</b>	Self-restraining; not indulging an appetite especially for food or drink. <i>Not totally <b>abstinent</b> but abstemious.</i>
<b>blameless</b>	Innocent of wrongdoing. <i>He led a <b>blameless</b> life.</i>
<b>celibate</b>	Abstaining from sexual intercourse. <i>A <b>celibate</b> priest.</i>

<b><u>chaste</u></b>	Abstaining from extramarital, or from all, sexual intercourse. <i>A <b>chaste</b> border of conventionalized flowers.</i>
<b>clean</b>	Ritually clean or pure. <i>Keep the wound <b>clean</b>.</i>
<b><u>ethical</u></b>	Adhering to ethical and moral principles. <i>An expert on <b>ethical</b> investment.</i>
<b><u>exemplary</u></b>	(of damages) exceeding the amount needed for simple compensation. <i><b>Exemplary</b> behavior.</i>
<b>good</b>	Giving pleasure; enjoyable or satisfying. <i>She speaks <b>good</b> English.</i>
<b>guiltless</b>	Having no guilt; innocent. <i>People are forever criticizing the service and I am not myself <b>guiltless</b> in this.</i>
<b>high-minded</b>	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks.
<b><u>honest</u></b>	Without pretensions. <i>My <b>honest</b> opinion.</i>
<b>honourable</b>	Deserving of esteem and respect. <i>This is the only <b>honourable</b> course.</i>
<b>incorruptible</b>	Incapable of being morally corrupted. <i><b>Incorruptible</b> judges are the backbone of the society.</i>
<b><u>irreproachable</u></b>	Free of guilt; not subject to blame. <i>His private life was <b>irreproachable</b>.</i>
<b><u>just</u></b>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>We all get our <b>just</b> deserts.</i>
<b>law-abiding</b>	Adhering strictly to laws and rules and customs.
<b><u>lawful</u></b>	Of a child born within a lawful marriage. <i><b>Lawful</b> methods of dissent.</i>
<b>maidenly</b>	Befitting or characteristic of a maiden. <i><b>Maidenly</b> modesty.</i>
<b>moral</b>	Holding or manifesting high principles for proper conduct. <i>A <b>moral</b> lesson.</i>
<b>principled</b>	Based on or manifesting objectively defined standards of rightness or morality. <i><b>Principled</b> pragmatism and <b>unprincipled</b> expediency.</i>
<b><u>pure</u></b>	Of color being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i><b>Pure</b> folly.</i>

<b>right-minded</b>	Disposed toward or having views based on what is right- Bertrand Russell.
<b>righteous</b>	Characterized by or proceeding from accepted standards of morality or justice. <i>Righteous indignation.</i>
<b>unbribable</b>	(of a person) not susceptible to bribery.
<b>unimpeachable</b>	Beyond doubt or reproach. <i>An unimpeachable reputation.</i>
<b>upright</b>	Upright in position or posture. <i>An upright and respectable man.</i>
<b>upstanding</b>	Meriting respect or esteem. <i>Upstanding feathered plumes.</i>
<b>vestal</b>	Relating to the Roman goddess Vesta. <i>A vestal temple.</i>
<b>virginal</b>	Being, relating to, or appropriate for a virgin. <i>Nor is there anything more virginal than the shimmer of young foliage.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Virtuous" as an adjective

- *She considered herself very virtuous because she neither drank nor smoked.*

## Associations of "Virtuous" (30 Words)

<b>acquit</b>	Free (someone) from a criminal charge by a verdict of not guilty. <i>She was acquitted on all counts.</i>
<b>blameless</b>	Innocent of wrongdoing. <i>Has lived a blameless life.</i>
<b>chaste</b>	Without unnecessary ornamentation; simple or restrained. <i>A chaste consoling embrace.</i>
<b>cherub</b>	A representation of a cherub in Western art depicted as a chubby healthy looking child with wings. <i>A wistful cherub of eighteen months photographed at her playgroup.</i>
<b>clean</b>	Clean and tidy up the house. <i>The trees were cleaned of apples by the storm.</i>
<b>ethical</b>	Adhering to ethical and moral principles. <i>All types of drugs including ethical drugs and over the counter pharmaceuticals.</i>

<b><u>flawless</u></b>	Without any imperfections or defects; perfect. <i>Her smooth <b>flawless</b> skin.</i>
<b>guiltless</b>	Free from evil or guilt. <i>People are forever criticizing the service and I am not myself <b>guiltless</b> in this.</i>
<b><u>harmless</u></b>	Inoffensive. <i>The venom of most spiders is <b>harmless</b> to humans.</i>
<b><u>immaculate</u></b>	Free from flaws or mistakes; perfect. <i>Timing and technique were <b>immaculate</b>.</i>
<b>impeccable</b>	Not capable of sin. <i>He had <b>impeccable</b> manners.</i>
<b>innocence</b>	Lack of guile or corruption; purity. <i>They must prove their <b>innocence</b>.</i>
<b>innocent</b>	Lacking sense or awareness. <i>A child s <b>innocent</b> stare.</i>
<b>innocuous</b>	Not causing disapproval. <i>It was an <b>innocuous</b> question.</i>
<b>inoffensive</b>	Not causing anger or annoyance. <i><b>Inoffensive</b> behavior.</i>
<b><u>irreproachable</u></b>	Free of guilt; not subject to blame. <i>His private life was <b>irreproachable</b>.</i>
<b><u>perfection</u></b>	The act of making something perfect. <i>Among the key tasks was the <b>perfection</b> of new mechanisms of economic management.</i>
<b><u>pristine</u></b>	Completely free from dirt or contamination. <i>A <b>pristine</b> white shirt.</i>
<b><u>pure</u></b>	Being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i>80 <b>pure</b> bred stallions were on parade.</i>
<b><u>purity</u></b>	A woman's virtue or chastity. <i>White roses represent <b>purity</b> and innocence.</i>
<b><u>righteous</u></b>	Very good; excellent. <i>Feelings of <b>righteous</b> indignation about pay and conditions.</i>
<b><u>sheer</u></b>	Cause to sheer. <i><b>Sheer</b> silk stockings.</i>
<b>sinless</b>	Free from sin. <i>The <b>sinless</b> life of Christ.</i>

<b>unblemished</b>	Not damaged or marked in any way. <i>An <b>unblemished</b> complexion.</i>
<b>unexceptionable</b>	Completely acceptable; not open to exception or reproach. <i>The <b>unexceptionable</b> belief that society should be governed by law.</i>
<b>unimpeachable</b>	Not able to be doubted, questioned, or criticized; entirely trustworthy. <i>An <b>unimpeachable</b> witness.</i>
<b>unmixed</b>	Not mixed. <i>Bold <b>unmixed</b> colours.</i>
<b>unspotted</b>	Unnoticed. <i>It has an <b>unspotted</b> white throat.</i>
<b>unsullied</b>	Free from blemishes. <i>His <b>unsullied</b> name.</i>
<b><u>untainted</u></b>	Not contaminated, polluted, or tainted. <i>The island remains virtually <b>untainted</b> by commercialism.</i>
