- Resistance of a liquid to shear forces (and hence to flow.
- The state of being thick, sticky, and semi-fluid in consistency, due to internal friction.
- A quantity expressing the magnitude of internal friction in a fluid, as measured by the force per unit area resisting uniform flow.

cohesion	The sticking together of particles of the same substance. The work at present lacks cohesion .
degree of density	The seriousness of something (e.g., a burn or crime.
degree of thickness	The highest power of a term or variable.
<u>density</u>	The degree of compactness of a substance. A density of 10 000 per square mile.
firmness	Resolute determination and strength of character. I felt the firmness of his upper arm.
heaviness	Unwelcome burdensome difficulty. The heaviness of a hop aroma.
solidity	The quality or state of being firm or strong in structure. The sheer strength and solidity of Romanesque architecture.

He gave his eyes time to adjust to the thickness of the fog.viscousnessResistance of a liquid to shear forces (and hence to flow.

<u>melt</u>	A sandwich hamburger or other dish containing or topped with melted cheese. <i>Melt butter.</i>
mucous	Of or secreting or covered with or resembling mucus. <i>Mucous</i> glands of the intestine.
obstinacy	The quality or condition of being obstinate; stubbornness. <i>His reputation for obstinacy.</i>
obstinate	Persist stubbornly. <i>Her obstinate determination to pursue a career in radio.</i>
patience	The capacity to accept or tolerate delay, problems, or suffering without becoming annoyed or anxious. You can find bargains if you have the patience to sift through the rubbish.
perseverance	Persistence in doing something despite difficulty or delay in achieving success. Medicine is a field which requires dedication and perseverance .
persistence	The property of a continuous and connected period of time. Cardiff s persistence was rewarded with a try.
pertinacity	Persistent determination.
pitchy	Of the blackest black; similar to the color of jet or coal.
<u>slimy</u>	Morally reprehensible. A slimy little liar.
slippery	(of a surface or object) difficult to hold firmly or stand on because it is smooth, wet, or slimy. The word intended is a decidedly slippery one.



<u>sticky</u>	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive. Felt sticky and chilly at the same time.
<u>tacky</u>	Tastelessly showy. The paint was still tacky .
<u>tape</u>	Seal or mark off an area or thing with tape. The several recordings were combined on a master tape .
<u>tenacity</u>	The quality or fact of being very determined; determination. <i>The tenacity of certain myths within the historical record.</i>
<u>vigilance</u>	The process of paying close and continuous attention. Security duties that demand long hours of vigilance .
viscid	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive. <i>The viscid mucus lining of the intestine.</i>
<u>viscous</u>	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive. <i>Viscous lava</i> .
