Definitions of "Visible" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “visible” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Able to be perceived or noticed easily.*
- *Obvious to the eye.*
- *Capable of being seen; or open to easy view.*
- *Able to be seen.*
- *In a position of public prominence.*
- *(of light) within the range of wavelengths to which the eye is sensitive.*
- *Present and easily available.*
- *Relating to imports or exports of tangible commodities.*



Synonyms of "Visible" as an adjective (10 Words)

- detectable** Able to be perceived or noticed; discernible.
*An easily **detectable** and treatable disorder.*
- discernible** Capable of being perceived clearly.
*The skyline is easily **discernible** even at a distance of several miles.*
- in sight** Holding office.
- in view** Holding office.
- noticeable** Undesirably noticeable.
*A **noticeable** lack of friendliness.*
- observable** Able to be noticed or perceived; discernible.
*An **observable** change in behavior.*

perceivable Capable of being apprehended or understood.
***Perceivable** through the mist.*

perceptible Capable of being perceived by the mind or senses.
*Easily **perceptible** sounds.*

recognizable Easily perceived; easy to become aware of.
*There was no **recognizable** photograph of him.*

seeable Capable of being seen; or open to easy view.

Associations of "Visible" (30 Words)

- apparently** Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly’).
*The child nodded **apparently** content with the promise.*
- appreciable** Enough to be estimated or measured.
***Appreciable** amounts of noxious wastes are dumped into the harbor.*
- classifiable** Capable of being classified.
- clearly** In an easily perceptible manner.
*I could **clearly** see myself in his situation.*

detectable	Able to be discovered or identified. <i>A detectable note of sarcasm.</i>
dimly	With a faint light; not brightly. <i>The desert is dimly visible in the light of the moon.</i>
discernible	Able to be discerned; perceptible. <i>An essay with a meaning that was not always discernible.</i>
distinctly	Clear to the mind; with distinct mental discernment. <i>He looked distinctly uncomfortable.</i>
<u>evident</u>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>A clearly evident erasure in the manuscript.</i>
eye	A rounded eye like marking on an animal such as those on the tail of a peacock an eyespot. <i>Withered potatoes sprouting at the eyes.</i>
faintly	In a faint manner; indistinctly. <i>His faintly ridiculous air.</i>
identifiable	Capable of being identified. <i>There are no easily identifiable features on the shoreline.</i>
intelligible	Well articulated or enunciated, and loud enough to be heard distinctly. <i>Use vocabulary that is intelligible to your audience.</i>
macroscopic	Large enough to be visible with the naked eye.
<u>manifest</u>	Record in a ship s manifest. <i>Manifest disapproval.</i>
marked	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>A scar marked face.</i>
<u>noticeable</u>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>Noticeable for its vivid historical background.</i>
observable	Able to be noticed or perceived; discernible. <i>An observable change in behavior.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>It was obvious a storm was coming in.</i>
ocular	Relating to or using sight. <i>Ocular muscles.</i>
optic	A lens or other optical component in an optical instrument. <i>An optical illusion.</i>
optical	Constructed to assist sight. <i>Optical telescopes.</i>
palpability	The quality of being perceivable by touch.

palpable	(medicine) can be felt by palpation. <i>Felt sudden anger in a palpable wave.</i>
perceptible	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>A perceptible limp.</i>
recognizable	Capable of being recognized. <i>This situation produces recognizable stress symptoms.</i>
sight	Take a detailed visual measurement of something with or as with a sight. <i>In his sight she could do no wrong.</i>
tangibility	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
telescopic	Having or consisting of concentric tubular sections designed to slide into one another. <i>A bright star with a telescopic companion.</i>
visibly	In a way that is visible to the eye. <i>The defendant paled visibly as the guilty verdict was announced.</i>
