- Capable of being seen; or open to easy view.
- Able to be seen.
- In a position of public prominence.
- (of light) within the range of wavelengths to which the eye is sensitive.
- Present and easily available.
- Relating to imports or exports of tangible commodities.

Capable of being apprehended or understood. perceivable


