## Visible as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Visible" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “visible” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Able to be perceived or noticed easily.*
- *Obvious to the eye.*
- *Capable of being seen; or open to easy view.*
- *Able to be seen.*
- *In a position of public prominence.*
- *(of light) within the range of wavelengths to which the eye is sensitive.*
- *Present and easily available.*
- *Relating to imports or exports of tangible commodities.*



## Synonyms of "Visible" as an adjective (10 Words)

- detectable** Able to be perceived or noticed; discernible.  
*An easily **detectable** and treatable disorder.*
- discernible** Capable of being perceived clearly.  
*The skyline is easily **discernible** even at a distance of several miles.*
- in sight** Holding office.
- in view** Holding office.
- noticeable** Undesirably noticeable.  
*A **noticeable** lack of friendliness.*
- observable** Able to be noticed or perceived; discernible.  
*An **observable** change in behavior.*

**perceivable** Capable of being apprehended or understood.  
***Perceivable** through the mist.*

**perceptible** Capable of being perceived by the mind or senses.  
*Easily **perceptible** sounds.*

**recognizable** Easily perceived; easy to become aware of.  
*There was no **recognizable** photograph of him.*

**seeable** Capable of being seen; or open to easy view.

## Associations of "Visible" (30 Words)

- apparently** Unmistakably (‘plain’ is often used informally for ‘plainly’).  
*The child nodded **apparently** content with the promise.*
- appreciable** Enough to be estimated or measured.  
***Appreciable** amounts of noxious wastes are dumped into the harbor.*
- classifiable** Capable of being classified.
- clearly** In an easily perceptible manner.  
*I could **clearly** see myself in his situation.*

<b>detectable</b>	Able to be discovered or identified. <i>A <b>detectable</b> note of sarcasm.</i>
<b>dimly</b>	With a faint light; not brightly. <i>The desert is <b>dimly</b> visible in the light of the moon.</i>
<b>discernible</b>	Able to be discerned; perceptible. <i>An essay with a meaning that was not always <b>discernible</b>.</i>
<b>distinctly</b>	Clear to the mind; with distinct mental discernment. <i>He looked <b>distinctly</b> uncomfortable.</i>
<b><u>evident</u></b>	Capable of being seen or noticed. <i>A clearly <b>evident</b> erasure in the manuscript.</i>
<b>eye</b>	A rounded eye like marking on an animal such as those on the tail of a peacock an eyespot. <i>Withered potatoes sprouting at the <b>eyes</b>.</i>
<b>faintly</b>	In a faint manner; indistinctly. <i>His <b>faintly</b> ridiculous air.</i>
<b>identifiable</b>	Capable of being identified. <i>There are no easily <b>identifiable</b> features on the shoreline.</i>
<b>intelligible</b>	Well articulated or enunciated, and loud enough to be heard distinctly. <i>Use vocabulary that is <b>intelligible</b> to your audience.</i>
<b>macroscopic</b>	Large enough to be visible with the naked eye.
<b><u>manifest</u></b>	Record in a ship s manifest. <i><b>Manifest</b> disapproval.</i>
<b>marked</b>	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>A scar <b>marked</b> face.</i>
<b><u>noticeable</u></b>	Undesirably noticeable. <i><b>Noticeable</b> for its vivid historical background.</i>
<b>observable</b>	Able to be noticed or perceived; discernible. <i>An <b>observable</b> change in behavior.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>It was <b>obvious</b> a storm was coming in.</i>
<b>ocular</b>	Relating to or using sight. <i><b>Ocular</b> muscles.</i>
<b>optic</b>	A lens or other optical component in an optical instrument. <i>An <b>optical</b> illusion.</i>
<b>optical</b>	Constructed to assist sight. <i><b>Optical</b> telescopes.</i>
<b>palpability</b>	The quality of being perceivable by touch.

<b>palpable</b>	(medicine) can be felt by palpation. <i>Felt sudden anger in a <b>palpable</b> wave.</i>
<b>perceptible</b>	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>A <b>perceptible</b> limp.</i>
<b>recognizable</b>	Capable of being recognized. <i>This situation produces <b>recognizable</b> stress symptoms.</i>
<b>sight</b>	Take a detailed visual measurement of something with or as with a sight. <i>In his <b>sight</b> she could do no wrong.</i>
<b>tangibility</b>	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
<b>telescopic</b>	Having or consisting of concentric tubular sections designed to slide into one another. <i>A bright star with a <b>telescopic</b> companion.</i>
<b>visibly</b>	In a way that is visible to the eye. <i>The defendant paled <b>visibly</b> as the guilty verdict was announced.</i>
