- *A mental view of a succession of remembered or anticipated events.*

<b>panorama</b>	The visual percept of a region. <i>The tower offers a wonderful <b>panorama</b> of Prague.</i>
<b>perspective</b>	The art of representing three-dimensional objects on a two-dimensional surface so as to give the right impression of their height, width, depth, and position in relation to each other. <i>Most guidebook history is written from the editor's <b>perspective</b>.</i>
<b>prospect</b>	An extensive view of landscape. <i>Some training which offered a <b>prospect</b> of continuous employment.</i>
<u><b>scene</b></u>	The pieces of scenery used in a play or opera. <i>The police returned to the <b>scene</b> of the crime.</i>
<b>sight</b>	A thing that one sees or that can be seen. <i>We are all equal in the <b>sight</b> of God.</i>
<b>spectacle</b>	A blunder that makes you look ridiculous used in the phrase make a spectacle of yourself. <i>The show is pure <b>spectacle</b>.</i>
<b>view</b>	Purpose the phrase with a view to means with the intention of or for the purpose of. <i>Matisse's <b>view</b> of Collioure.</i>

<b>anthropocentric</b>	<i>When we assess animal intelligence we tend to take a very <b>anthropocentric</b> view.</i>
<b>aspect</b>	Of a planet form an aspect with another celestial body. <i>The front <b>aspect</b> of the hotel was unremarkable.</i>
<b><u>backdrop</u></b>	A painted cloth hung at the back of a theatre stage as part of the scenery. <i>The rolling hills that <b>backdropped</b> our camp.</i>
<b><u>background</u></b>	Provide with background. <i>They got a bad connection and could hardly hear one another over the <b>background</b> signals.</i>

<b>broad</b>	Broad in scope or content. <i>The company has a <b>broad</b> range of experience.</i>
<b>cityscape</b>	A picture of a city. <i>Shades of red brick which once coloured the <b>cityscape</b>.</i>
<b>diorama</b>	A model representing a scene with three-dimensional figures, either in miniature or as a large-scale museum exhibit.
<b>environment</b>	The setting or conditions in which a particular activity is carried on. <i>A good learning <b>environment</b>.</i>
<b>facet</b>	A smooth surface (as of a bone or cut gemstone). <i>A blue and green jewel that shines from a million <b>facets</b>.</i>
<b>foreground</b>	Move into the foreground to make more visible or prominent. <i>The intricate garden depicted in the <b>foreground</b>.</i>
<b>homocentric</b>	Having the same centre.
<b>landscape</b>	Do landscape gardening. <i>We changed the <b>landscape</b> for solving the problem of payroll inequity.</i>
<b>locale</b>	A place where something happens or is set, or that has particular events associated with it. <i>Her summers were spent in a variety of exotic <b>locales</b>.</i>
<b>objectively</b>	In a way that is not dependent on the mind for existence; actually. <i>The researchers are <b>objectively</b> assessing risk factors.</i>
<b>outlook</b>	A person's point of view or general attitude to life. <i>The <b>outlook</b> for tomorrow is dry and cold.</i>
<b>panorama</b>	The visual percept of a region. <i>The tower offers a wonderful <b>panorama</b> of Prague.</i>
<b>panoramic</b>	(of a view or picture) with a wide view surrounding the observer; sweeping. <i>A <b>panoramic</b> view.</i>
<b>personally</b>	As yourself. <i>He had spoken <b>personally</b> and emotionally.</i>
<b>perspective</b>	The appearance of viewed objects with regard to their relative position, distance from the viewer, etc. <i>Most guidebook history is written from the editor's <b>perspective</b>.</i>
<b>perspicacity</b>	The capacity to assess situations or circumstances shrewdly and to draw sound conclusions. <i>The <b>perspicacity</b> of her remarks.</i>
<b>pomp</b>	Vain and ostentatious display. <i>Entertaining overseas visitors with the right degree of <b>pomp</b>.</i>

<b><u>scene</u></b>	The pieces of scenery used in a play or opera. <i>Thick snow had turned the <b>scene</b> outside into a picture postcard.</i>
<b>scenery</b>	The painted background used to represent natural features or other surroundings on a theatre stage or film set. <i>They had all helped with <b>scenery</b> and costumes.</i>
<b>scenic</b>	Relating to theatrical scenery. <i>The trend to <b>scenic</b> figural work.</i>
<b>setting</b>	A piece of metal in which a precious stone or gem is fixed to form a piece of jewellery. <i>A romantic house in a wonderful <b>setting</b> beside the River Wye.</i>
<b><u>spacious</u></b>	Very large in expanse or scope. <i>A <b>spacious</b> ballroom.</i>
<b><u>standpoint</u></b>	A mental position from which things are viewed. <i>She writes on religion from the <b>standpoint</b> of a believer.</i>
<b>sylvan</b>	A spirit that lives in or frequents the woods. <i>A <b>sylvan</b> glade.</i>
<b>view</b>	Purpose the phrase with a view to means with the intention of or for the purpose of. <i>Prospective buyers are requested to make an appointment to <b>view</b> the house.</i>
<b><u>wide</u></b>	A ball that is judged to be too wide of the stumps for the batsman to play for which an extra is awarded to the batting side. <i>He will play <b>wide</b> on the right.</i>
