Containing bubbles or making a bubbling sound.

buoyant	Able or tending to keep afloat or rise to the top of a liquid or gas. <i>Car sales were buoyant.</i>
carefree	Free from anxiety or responsibility. <i>We were young and carefree.</i>
<u>cheerful</u>	Causing happiness by its nature or appearance. <i>The room was painted in cheerful colours.</i>
cheery	Happy and optimistic. <i>A cheery hello.</i>
dynamic	Of or relating to dynamics. <i>A dynamic market.</i>
<u>ebullient</u>	Cheerful and full of energy. <i>Misted and ebullient seas.</i>
<u>effervescent</u>	Giving off bubbles. <i>An effervescent mixture of cheap wine fruit flavours sugar and carbon dioxide.</i>
<u>energetic</u>	Relating to or characterized by energy (in the technical sense). <i>An energetic group of hikers.</i>
enthusiastic	Having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. <i>Was enthusiastic about taking ballet lessons.</i>
full of fun	Constituting the full quantity or extent; complete.
full of life	Having marked deepness and body.
full of the joys of spring	Being at a peak or culminating point.
full of vim and vigour	Being at a peak or culminating point.
happy	Inclined to use a specified thing excessively or at random. <i>A happy turn of phrase.</i>
happy-go-lucky	Having or bringing good fortune.
high-spirited	Joyously unrestrained.
irrepressible	Not able to be controlled or restrained. <i>An irrepressible rogue.</i>
jaunty	Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air. <i>A jaunty optimist.</i>
<u>jolly</u>	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment- Wordsworth. <i>The jolly crowd at the reunion.</i>
<u>joyful</u>	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>Make a joyful noise.</i>

light-hearted	Carefree and happy and lighthearted.
lively	Quick and energetic. <i>A lively gait.</i>
<u>merry</u>	Offering fun and gaiety. <i>After the third beer he began to feel quite merry.</i>
perky	Cheeky. <i>A perky little widow in her 70s.</i>
scintillating	Brilliantly and excitingly clever or skilful. <i>The team produced a scintillating second half performance.</i>
<u>sparkling</u>	Lively and witty. <i>Her sparkling blue eyes.</i>
<u>spirited</u>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A spirited dance.</i>
<u>sunny</u>	Bright with sunlight. <i>A sunny smile.</i>
<u>vibrant</u>	Vigorous and animated. <i>A vibrant group that challenged the system.</i>
<u>vigorous</u>	Strong, healthy, and full of energy. <i>Vigorous opposition to the war.</i>
<u>vital</u>	Full of spirit; full of life. <i>A vital spot.</i>
<u>vivid</u>	Having striking color. <i>A vivid recollection.</i>
zestful	Marked by spirited enjoyment. <i>A zestful and exuberant player.</i>

animated	Full of life or excitement; lively. <i>An animated and expressive face.</i>
boisterous	Violently agitated and turbulent- Ezra Pound. <i>Boisterous winds and waves.</i>
bouncing	Vigorously healthy. <i>Lisa gave birth to a bouncing baby boy.</i>
<u>bouncy</u>	(of music) having a pleasingly jaunty rhythm. <i>A bouncy ball.</i>
<u>ebullient</u>	Cheerful and full of energy. <i>She sounded ebullient and happy.</i>

effusive	Showing or expressing gratitude, pleasure, or approval in an unrestrained or heartfelt manner. <i>An effusive welcome.</i>
exuberant	Unrestrained, especially with regard to feelings. <i>Exuberant foliage.</i>
feisty	Quick to take offense. <i>A love story with a feisty heroine who s more than a pretty face.</i>
happy	Enjoying or showing or marked by joy or pleasure. <i>We will be happy to advise you.</i>
jaunty	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A jaunty red hat.</i>
joyful	Full of or producing joy. <i>Make a joyful noise.</i>
kicking	An assault in which the victim is kicked repeatedly. <i>They gave him a good kicking.</i>
lively	Full of life and energy; active and outgoing. <i>A lively discussion.</i>
luxuriant	Produced or growing in extreme abundance. <i>She tossed her luxuriant dark hair.</i>
overweening	Showing excessive confidence or pride. <i>Had a witty but overweening manner.</i>
pert	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>No need to be pert miss.</i>
plucky	Marked by courage and determination in the face of difficulties or danger; robust and uninhibited-Judith Crist. <i>The plucky youngster has astounded medical staff.</i>
praise	The expression of approval or admiration for someone or something. <i>He always appreciated praise for his work.</i>
saucy	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>The beret was perched at a saucy angle on her blonde hair.</i>
spirited	Made lively or spirited. <i>A spirited dance.</i>
sporting	Exhibiting or calling for sportsmanship or fair play. <i>A sporting chance.</i>
sprightly	(especially of an old person) lively; full of energy. <i>A sprightly dance.</i>

*A **superbly** gifted writer.*
- vibrant** Quivering; pulsating.
*The men s **vibrant** voices.*
- vivid** Producing powerful feelings or strong, clear images in the mind.
***Vivid** green.*
- wonderfully** (used as an intensifier) extremely well.
*A **wonderfully** entertaining show.*
- zesty** Marked by spirited enjoyment.
