Not made dim or less bright.  
*The **bright** green leaves.*

**bubbling**

Containing bubbles or making a bubbling sound.  
*A **bubbling** cocktail party.*

Containing bubbles.  
*Bright **bubbly** children.*

<b>buoyant</b>	Able or tending to keep afloat or rise to the top of a liquid or gas. <i>Car sales were <b>buoyant</b>.</i>
<b>carefree</b>	Free from anxiety or responsibility. <i>We were young and <b>carefree</b>.</i>
<b><u>cheerful</u></b>	Causing happiness by its nature or appearance. <i>The room was painted in <b>cheerful</b> colours.</i>
<b>cheery</b>	Happy and optimistic. <i>A <b>cheery</b> hello.</i>
<b>dynamic</b>	Of or relating to dynamics. <i>A <b>dynamic</b> market.</i>
<b><u>ebullient</u></b>	Cheerful and full of energy. <i>Misted and <b>ebullient</b> seas.</i>
<b><u>effervescent</u></b>	Giving off bubbles. <i>An <b>effervescent</b> mixture of cheap wine fruit flavours sugar and carbon dioxide.</i>
<b><u>energetic</u></b>	Relating to or characterized by energy (in the technical sense). <i>An <b>energetic</b> group of hikers.</i>
<b>enthusiastic</b>	Having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. <i>Was <b>enthusiastic</b> about taking ballet lessons.</i>
<b>full of fun</b>	Constituting the full quantity or extent; complete.
<b>full of life</b>	Having marked deepness and body.
<b>full of the joys of spring</b>	Being at a peak or culminating point.
<b>full of vim and vigour</b>	Being at a peak or culminating point.
<b>happy</b>	Inclined to use a specified thing excessively or at random. <i>A <b>happy</b> turn of phrase.</i>
<b>happy-go-lucky</b>	Having or bringing good fortune.
<b>high-spirited</b>	Joyously unrestrained.
<b>irrepressible</b>	Not able to be controlled or restrained. <i>An <b>irrepressible</b> rogue.</i>
<b>jaunty</b>	Having a cheerful, lively, and self-confident air. <i>A <b>jaunty</b> optimist.</i>
<b><u>jolly</u></b>	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment- Wordsworth. <i>The <b>jolly</b> crowd at the reunion.</i>
<b><u>joyful</u></b>	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>Make a <b>joyful</b> noise.</i>

<b>light-hearted</b>	Carefree and happy and lighthearted.
<b>lively</b>	Quick and energetic. <i>A <b>lively</b> gait.</i>
<u><b>merry</b></u>	Offering fun and gaiety. <i>After the third beer he began to feel quite <b>merry</b>.</i>
<b>perky</b>	Cheeky. <i>A <b>perky</b> little widow in her 70s.</i>
<b>scintillating</b>	Brilliantly and excitingly clever or skilful. <i>The team produced a <b>scintillating</b> second half performance.</i>
<u><b>sparkling</b></u>	Lively and witty. <i>Her <b>sparkling</b> blue eyes.</i>
<u><b>spirited</b></u>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A <b>spirited</b> dance.</i>
<u><b>sunny</b></u>	Bright with sunlight. <i>A <b>sunny</b> smile.</i>
<u><b>vibrant</b></u>	Vigorous and animated. <i>A <b>vibrant</b> group that challenged the system.</i>
<u><b>vigorous</b></u>	Strong, healthy, and full of energy. <i><b>Vigorous</b> opposition to the war.</i>
<u><b>vital</b></u>	Full of spirit; full of life. <i>A <b>vital</b> spot.</i>
<u><b>vivid</b></u>	Having striking color. <i>A <b>vivid</b> recollection.</i>
<b>zestful</b>	Marked by spirited enjoyment. <i>A <b>zestful</b> and exuberant player.</i>

<b>boisterous</b>	Violently agitated and turbulent- Ezra Pound. <i><b>Boisterous</b> winds and waves.</i>
<b>bouncing</b>	Vigorously healthy. <i>Lisa gave birth to a <b>bouncing</b> baby boy.</i>
<u><b>bouncy</b></u>	(of music) having a pleasingly jaunty rhythm. <i>A <b>bouncy</b> ball.</i>
<u><b>ebullient</b></u>	Cheerful and full of energy. <i>She sounded <b>ebullient</b> and happy.</i>

<b>effusive</b>	Showing or expressing gratitude, pleasure, or approval in an unrestrained or heartfelt manner. <i>An <b>effusive</b> welcome.</i>
<b>exuberant</b>	Unrestrained, especially with regard to feelings. <i><b>Exuberant</b> foliage.</i>
<b>feisty</b>	Quick to take offense. <i>A love story with a <b>feisty</b> heroine who s more than a pretty face.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Enjoying or showing or marked by joy or pleasure. <i>We will be <b>happy</b> to advise you.</i>
<b>jaunty</b>	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A <b>jaunty</b> red hat.</i>
<b>joyful</b>	Full of or producing joy. <i>Make a <b>joyful</b> noise.</i>
<b>kicking</b>	An assault in which the victim is kicked repeatedly. <i>They gave him a good <b>kicking</b>.</i>
<b>lively</b>	Full of life and energy; active and outgoing. <i>A <b>lively</b> discussion.</i>
<b>luxuriant</b>	Produced or growing in extreme abundance. <i>She tossed her <b>luxuriant</b> dark hair.</i>
<b>overweening</b>	Showing excessive confidence or pride. <i>Had a witty but <b>overweening</b> manner.</i>
<b>pert</b>	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>No need to be <b>pert</b> miss.</i>
<b>plucky</b>	Marked by courage and determination in the face of difficulties or danger; robust and uninhibited-Judith Crist. <i>The <b>plucky</b> youngster has astounded medical staff.</i>
<b>praise</b>	The expression of approval or admiration for someone or something. <i>He always appreciated <b>praise</b> for his work.</i>
<b>saucy</b>	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>The beret was perched at a <b>saucy</b> angle on her blonde hair.</i>
<b>spirited</b>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A <b>spirited</b> dance.</i>
<b>sporting</b>	Exhibiting or calling for sportsmanship or fair play. <i>A <b>sporting</b> chance.</i>
<b>sprightly</b>	(especially of an old person) lively; full of energy. <i>A <b>sprightly</b> dance.</i>

<b>superbly</b>	(used as an intensifier) extremely well. <i>A <b>superbly</b> gifted writer.</i>
<b>vibrant</b>	Quivering; pulsating. <i>The men s <b>vibrant</b> voices.</i>
<b>vivid</b>	Producing powerful feelings or strong, clear images in the mind. <i><b>Vivid</b> green.</i>
<b>wonderfully</b>	(used as an intensifier) extremely well. <i>A <b>wonderfully</b> entertaining show.</i>
