<b>animated</b>	(of a film or image) made using animation techniques. <i><b>Animated</b> conversation.</i>
<b><a href="#">animation</a></b>	The manipulation of electronic images by means of a computer in order to create moving images. <i>They started talking with <b>animation</b>.</i>
<b>charged</b>	Filled with excitement, tension, or emotion. <i>A <b>charged</b> battery.</i>
<b>demonstrative</b>	A demonstrative determiner or pronoun. <i>The possibility of a <b>demonstrative</b> science of ethics.</i>
<b>effusive</b>	Relating to the eruption of large volumes of molten rock. <i>An <b>effusive</b> welcome.</i>
<b>energy</b>	Physics a thermodynamic quantity equivalent to the capacity of a physical system to do work the units of energy are joules or ergs. <i>Jogging works off my excess <b>energy</b>.</i>
<b>enforced</b>	Caused by necessity or force; compulsory. <i>A life of <b>enforced</b> inactivity.</i>
<b>enthusiasm</b>	Something that arouses enthusiasm. <i><b>Enthusiasm</b> for his program is growing.</i>
<b>excitement</b>	Something that arouses a feeling of excitement. <i>His face was flushed with <b>excitement</b> and his hands trembled.</i>

<b>exuberance</b>	The quality of being full of energy, excitement, and cheerfulness; ebullience. <i>A sense of youthful <b>exuberance</b>.</i>
<b>fever</b>	The state of being emotionally aroused and worked up.
<b>humour</b>	The ability to express humour or amuse other people. <i>Their inimitable brand of <b>humour</b>.</i>
<b>hyperactive</b>	More active than normal. <i>A <b>hyperactive</b> pituitary gland.</i>
<b>impel</b>	Drive forward; propel. <i>Vital energies <b>impel</b> him in unforeseen directions.</i>
<b>irrepressible</b>	Not able to be controlled or restrained. <i>A great shout of <b>irrepressible</b> laughter.</i>
<b>metabolism</b>	The chemical processes that occur within a living organism in order to maintain life. <i>The <b>metabolism</b> of fatty acids in the kidney.</i>
<b>panache</b>	Flamboyant confidence of style or manner. <i>He entertained London society with great <b>panache</b>.</i>
<b>revive</b>	Restore from a depressed, inactive, or unused state. <i>The doctors <b>revived</b> the comatose man.</i>
<b>sensation</b>	The capacity to have physical sensations. <i>His arrest for poisoning caused a <b>sensation</b>.</i>
<b>spirited</b>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A warm hearted generous <b>spirited</b> man.</i>
<b>sporting</b>	Relating to or used in sports. <i>A <b>sporting</b> solution of the disagreement.</i>
<b>verve</b>	An energetic style. <i>Kollo sings with supreme <b>verve</b> and flexibility.</i>
<b>vibrant</b>	Full of energy and life. <i>A huge room decorated in <b>vibrant</b> blues and greens.</i>
<b>vigorously</b>	In a way that involves physical strength, effort, or energy; strenuously. <i>He <b>vigorously</b> denied the allegation.</i>
<b>vim</b>	A healthy capacity for vigorous activity. <i>He seemed full of <b>vim</b> and vigor.</i>
<b>vital</b>	Urgently needed; absolutely necessary. <i>The loss of <b>vital</b> heat in shock.</i>
<b>vitality</b>	A healthy capacity for vigorous activity. <i>Changes that will give renewed <b>vitality</b> to our democracy.</i>
