enforced	Caused by necessity or force; compulsory. <i>A life of enforced inactivity.</i>
enthusiasm	Something that arouses enthusiasm. <i>Enthusiasm for his program is growing.</i>
excitement	Something that arouses a feeling of excitement. <i>His face was flushed with excitement and his hands trembled.</i>

exuberance	The quality of being full of energy, excitement, and cheerfulness; ebullience. <i>A sense of youthful exuberance.</i>
 fervor	The state of being emotionally aroused and worked up.
humour	The ability to express humour or amuse other people. <i>Their inimitable brand of humour.</i>
hyperactive	More active than normal. <i>A hyperactive pituitary gland.</i>
impel	Drive forward; propel. <i>Vital energies impel him in unforeseen directions.</i>
irrepressible	Not able to be controlled or restrained. <i>A great shout of irrepressible laughter.</i>
metabolism	The chemical processes that occur within a living organism in order to maintain life. <i>The metabolism of fatty acids in the kidney.</i>
panache	Flamboyant confidence of style or manner. <i>He entertained London society with great panache.</i>
revive	Restore from a depressed, inactive, or unused state. <i>The doctors revived the comatose man.</i>
sensation	The capacity to have physical sensations. <i>His arrest for poisoning caused a sensation.</i>
spirited	Made lively or spirited. <i>A warm hearted generous spirited man.</i>
sporting	Relating to or used in sports. <i>A sporting solution of the disagreement.</i>
verve	An energetic style. <i>Kollo sings with supreme verve and flexibility.</i>
vibrant	Full of energy and life. <i>A huge room decorated in vibrant blues and greens.</i>
vigorously	In a way that involves physical strength, effort, or energy; strenuously. <i>He vigorously denied the allegation.</i>
vim	A healthy capacity for vigorous activity. <i>He seemed full of vim and vigor.</i>
vital	Urgently needed; absolutely necessary. <i>The loss of vital heat in shock.</i>
vitality	A healthy capacity for vigorous activity. <i>Changes that will give renewed vitality to our democracy.</i>
