red-hot	Characterized by intense emotion or interest or excitement.

shapely	(especially of a woman or part of her body) having an attractive or well-proportioned shape. <i>A slim waist and shapely legs.</i>
sonsie	(of a woman's body) having a large bosom and pleasing curves.
sonsy	(of a woman's body) having a large bosom and pleasing curves.
stacked	(of a place or surface) filled or covered with goods. <i>The stacked chairs.</i>
sybaritic	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. <i>Their opulent and sybaritic lifestyle.</i>
toothsome	(of food) temptingly tasty. <i>A toothsome blonde in a tight dress.</i>
