<b><u>luscious</u></b>	(of food or drink) having a pleasingly rich, sweet taste. <i>The <b>luscious</b> brush strokes and warm colours of these late masterpieces.</i>
<b><u>lush</u></b>	Tender and full of juice. <i>These architecture magazines are full of the <b>lush</b> interiors of the rich and famous.</i>
<b>luxuriant</b>	Produced or growing in extreme abundance. <i>Forests of dark <b>luxuriant</b> foliage.</i>
<b><u>luxurious</u></b>	Extremely comfortable or elegant, especially when involving great expense. <i>A <b>luxurious</b> wallow in a scented bath.</i>
<b><u>opulent</u></b>	Rich and superior in quality. <i>His more <b>opulent</b> tenants.</i>
<b>red-hot</b>	Characterized by intense emotion or interest or excitement.
<b>self-indulgent</b>	Indulgent of your own appetites and desires- Havelock Ellis.
<b>shapely</b>	(especially of a woman or part of her body) having an attractive or well-proportioned shape. <i>A slim waist and <b>shapely</b> legs.</i>
<b>sonsie</b>	(of a woman's body) having a large bosom and pleasing curves.
<b>sonsy</b>	(of a woman's body) having a large bosom and pleasing curves.
<b><u>stacked</u></b>	(of a place or surface) filled or covered with goods. <i>The <b>stacked</b> chairs.</i>
<b>sybaritic</b>	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. <i>Their opulent and <b>sybaritic</b> lifestyle.</i>
<b>toothsome</b>	(of food) temptingly tasty. <i>A <b>toothsome</b> blonde in a tight dress.</i>

<b>well formed</b>	Resulting favorably.

<b><u>plenty</u></b>	A full supply. <i>It must have cost <b>plenty</b>.</i>
<b><u>ravenous</u></b>	Devouring or craving food in great quantities. <i>A <b>ravenous</b> boy.</i>
<b><u>savor</u></b>	Have flavor; taste of something. <i><b>Savor</b> the soup.</i>
<b>sensual</b>	Relating to or involving gratification of the senses and physical, especially sexual, pleasure. <i><b>Sensual</b> excesses.</i>
<b><u>sensuous</u></b>	Taking delight in beauty. <i>Her voice was rather deep but very <b>sensuous</b>.</i>
