- gluttonous** Excessively greedy.  
*A **gluttonous** cigar smoking capitalist.*

<b>greedy</b>	Immoderately desirous of acquiring e.g. wealth. <i>People driven from their land by <b>greedy</b> developers.</i>
<b><u>insatiable</u></b>	Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something especially sex. <i>So <b>insatiable</b> a gourmand as myself.</i>
<b>omnivorous</b>	(of an animal or person) feeding on a variety of food of both plant and animal origin. <i>An <b>omnivorous</b> reader.</i>
<b>prodigious</b>	Remarkably or impressively great in extent, size, or degree. <i>A <b>prodigious</b> vision.</i>
<b>rapacious</b>	Excessively greedy and grasping. <i>The <b>rapacious</b> wolf.</i>
<b>ravening</b>	Excessively greedy and grasping. <i><b>Ravening</b> creditors.</i>
<b><u>ravenous</u></b>	(of hunger or need) very great; voracious. <i><b>Ravenous</b> as wolves.</i>
<b>unappeasable</b>	Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty. <i>What began as an aspiration turned soon to an <b>unappeasable</b> hunger.</i>
<b><u>uncontrollable</u></b>	Not controllable. <i><b>Uncontrollable</b> pain.</i>
<b><u>uncontrolled</u></b>	Not controlled. <i>Some <b>uncontrolled</b> children rather marred the proceedings.</i>
<b><u>unquenchable</u></b>	Not able to be quenched. <i><b>Unquenchable</b> thirst.</i>
<b>wolfish</b>	Resembling or likened to a wolf, especially in being rapacious, voracious, or lascivious. <i>A <b>wolfish</b> grin.</i>

<b>appetite</b>	A feeling of craving something- Granville Hicks. <i>An <b>appetite</b> for life.</i>
<b>covetous</b>	Showing extreme cupidity; painfully desirous of another's advantages. <i>Jealous of his success and <b>covetous</b> of his possessions.</i>
<b><u>craving</u></b>	An intense desire for some particular thing. <i>A <b>craving</b> for chocolate.</i>
<b>desire</b>	Express a desire for. <i>There had been a time years ago when he had <b>desired</b> her.</i>
<b>desirous</b>	Having or characterized by desire. <i>The Pope was <b>desirous</b> of peace in Europe.</i>
<b>epicurean</b>	Of Epicurus or epicureanism. <i><b>Epicurean</b> pleasures.</i>
<b>glutton</b>	A person who is devoted to eating and drinking to excess. <i>He s a <b>glutton</b> for adventure.</i>
<b>gluttonous</b>	Excessively greedy. <i>A <b>gluttonous</b> cigar smoking capitalist.</i>
<b>gourmand</b>	A connoisseur of good food; a gourmet.
<b>grasping</b>	Immoderately desirous of acquiring e.g. wealth. <i>The lecture was beyond his most strenuous <b>graspings</b>.</i>
<b>greedy</b>	Having or showing an intense and selfish desire for wealth or power. <i>He s scoffed the lot the <b>greedy</b> pig.</i>
<b>hedonistic</b>	Devoted to pleasure. <i>A <b>hedonistic</b> existence of booze drugs and parties.</i>
<b>hungry</b>	Causing hunger. <i>I always find art galleries <b>hungry</b> work.</i>
<b><u>insatiable</u></b>	Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something especially sex. <i>An <b>insatiable</b> hunger for success.</i>
<b>jealousy</b>	The state or feeling of being jealous. <i>Cherish their official political freedom with fierce <b>jealousy</b>.</i>
<b><u>lecherous</u></b>	Having or showing excessive or offensive sexual desire. <i>She ignored his <b>lecherous</b> gaze.</i>
<b>lupine</b>	Any plant of the genus <i>Lupinus</i> ; bearing erect spikes of usually purplish-blue flowers.

<b>miser</b>	A stingy hoarder of money and possessions often living miserably. <i>A typical <b>miser</b> he hid his money in the house in various places.</i>
<b>miserly</b>	Of or characteristic of a miser. <i>He left a <b>miserly</b> tip.</i>
<b>moneylender</b>	Someone who lends money at excessive rates of interest.
<b>prehensile</b>	Having a keen intellect. <i><b>Prehensile</b> employers stingy with raises for their employees.</i>
<b>rapacious</b>	Excessively greedy and grasping. <i>A <b>rapacious</b> appetite.</i>
<b>ravening</b>	Devouring or craving food in great quantities. <i><b>Ravening</b> creditors.</i>
<b>ravenous</b>	Devouring or craving food in great quantities. <i><b>Ravenous</b> as wolves.</i>
<b>swine</b>	Stout-bodied short-legged omnivorous animals. <i>Mist is a <b>swine</b> in unfamiliar country.</i>
<b>tantalize</b>	Harass with persistent criticism or carping. <i>She still <b>tantalized</b> him.</i>
<b>unquenchable</b>	Not able to be quenched. <i><b>Unquenchable</b> thirst.</i>
<b>unscrupulous</b>	Without scruples or principles. <i><b>Unscrupulous</b> politicians who would be happy to sell their country in order to gain power.</i>
