Associations of "Voraciously" (30 Words)

acquisitive	Eager to acquire and possess things especially material possessions or ideas. <i>An acquisitive society in which the craving for material things seems never satisfied.</i>
addle	(of an egg) become rotten, producing no chick. <i>Being in love must have addled your brain.</i>
appetite	A strong desire or liking for something. <i>An appetite for life.</i>
covetous	Having or showing a great desire to possess something belonging to someone else. <i>Jealous of his success and covetous of his possessions.</i>
craving	A powerful desire for something. <i>A craving for chocolate.</i>
desire	Express a desire for. <i>A man of many desires.</i>
desirous	Having or characterized by desire. <i>The Pope was desirous of peace in Europe.</i>
epicurean	Of Epicurus or epicureanism. <i>Epicurean pleasures.</i>
glutton	An excessively greedy eater. <i>He is a glutton for adventure.</i>
gluttonous	Excessively greedy. <i>Overfed women and their gluttonous husbands.</i>
gourmand	A person who enjoys eating and often eats too much.
grasping	The act of gripping something firmly with the hands (or the tentacles). <i>The lecture was beyond his most strenuous graspings.</i>

greedy	Wanting to eat or drink more than one can reasonably consume. <i>He scoffed the lot the greedy pig.</i>
hedonistic	Engaged in the pursuit of pleasure; sensually self-indulgent. <i>Lives of unending hedonistic delight.</i>
hungry	Feeling hunger; feeling a need or desire to eat food. <i>A world full of hungry people.</i>
<u>insatiable</u>	Of a person having an insatiable appetite or desire for something especially sex. <i>An insatiable hunger for success.</i>
jealousy	Zealous vigilance. <i>Cherish their official political freedom with fierce jealousy.</i>
<u>lecherous</u>	Having or showing excessive or offensive sexual desire. <i>A lecherous gleam in his eye.</i>
lupine	Of or relating to or characteristic of wolves.
miser	A stingy hoarder of money and possessions often living miserably. <i>A typical miser he hid his money in the house in various places.</i>
miserly	Characterized by or indicative of lack of generosity. <i>His miserly great uncle proved to be worth nearly 1 million.</i>
moneylender	Someone who lends money at excessive rates of interest.
prehensile	Having a keen intellect. <i>Many monkeys have long prehensile tails which they use in swinging through the trees.</i>
rapacious	Excessively greedy and grasping. <i>A rapacious appetite.</i>
ravaging	(of a ferocious wild animal) extremely hungry and hunting for prey. <i>They turned on each other like ravaging wolves.</i>
<u>ravenous</u>	Devouring or craving food in great quantities. <i>I'd been out all day and was ravenous.</i>
swine	A pig. <i>She had a herd of swine.</i>
tantalize	Harass with persistent criticism or carping. <i>She still tantalized him.</i>
<u>unquenchable</u>	Not able to be quenched. <i>His enthusiasm was unquenchable.</i>
unscrupulous	Without scruples or principles. <i>Unscrupulous politicos who would be happy to sell their country in order to gain power.</i>
