### **Definitions of "Wages" as a noun**

- *A recompense for worthy acts or retribution for wrongdoing.*



## Synonyms of "Wages" as a noun (2 Words)

**payoff** Payment made to a person in a position of trust to corrupt his judgment.

**reward** A thing given in recognition of service, effort, or achievement.  
*The holiday was a **reward** for 40 years service with the company.*





## Usage Examples of "Wages" as a noun

- *The wages of sin is death.*



## Associations of "Wages" (30 Words)

### accrue

Grow by addition.

*All customs duties **accrued** to the federal government.*

### cash

Exchange for cash.

*The staff were paid in **cash**.*

### **compensation**

The action or process of awarding compensation.

*A **compensation** claim.*

### **creditor**

A person to whom money is owed by a debtor; someone to whom an obligation exists.

*He sold his Ferraris to pay off his **creditors**.*

<b>debt</b>	The state of owing something (especially money). <i>The firm is heavily in <b>debt</b>.</i>
<b>earnings</b>	Income derived from an investment or product. <i>They saved a quarter of all their <b>earnings</b>.</i>
<b>gratis</b>	Costing nothing. <i><b>Gratis</b> books.</i>
<b>installment</b>	A payment of part of a debt; usually paid at regular intervals.
<b>liquidate</b>	Convert (assets) into cash. <i>If the company was <b>liquidated</b> there would be enough funds released to honour the debts.</i>
<b>lucrative</b>	Producing a sizeable profit. <i>A <b>lucrative</b> career as a stand up comedian.</i>
<b>overdue</b>	Past due; not paid at the scheduled time. <i>An <b>overdue</b> installment.</i>
<b>owe</b>	Owe something especially money to. <i>This new theory <b>owes</b> much to Einstein s Relativity Theory.</i>
<b>owing</b>	Owed as a debt. <i>No rent was <b>owing</b>.</i>
<b>paid</b>	Involving gainful employment in something often done as a hobby. <i>Five weeks <b>paid</b> holiday a year.</i>
<b>paying</b>	For which money is paid. <i>A <b>paying</b> job.</i>
<b>payment</b>	An act of requiting; returning in kind. <i>A suit with a velvet collar that I got as <b>payment</b> for being in the show.</i>
<b>payoff</b>	Payment made to a person in a position of trust to corrupt his judgment.
<b>premium</b>	Payment for insurance. <i>They encouraged customers with a <b>premium</b> for loyal patronage.</i>
<b>recompense</b>	Compensation or reward given for loss or harm suffered or effort made. <i>Substantial damages were paid in <b>recompense</b>.</i>
<b>refund</b>	Money returned to a payer. <i>If you re not delighted with your purchase we guarantee to <b>refund</b> your money in full.</i>
<b>reimbursement</b>	A sum paid to cover money that has been spent or lost. <i>The family received insurance <b>reimbursements</b>.</i>
<b>remunerate</b>	Pay (someone) for services rendered or work done. <i>My efforts were not <b>remunerated</b>.</i>



<b>remuneration</b>	Something that remunerates. <i>Adequate <b>remuneration</b> for his work.</i>
<b>remunerative</b>	Producing a sizeable profit. <i><b>Remunerative</b> work.</i>
<b>repay</b>	Make repayment for or return something. <i>Most of his fortune had been spent <b>repaying</b> creditors.</i>
<b>repayment</b>	An amount of money paid back. <i>Minimum monthly <b>repayments</b>.</i>
<b>requite</b>	Make appropriate return for (a favour, service, or wrongdoing). <i>She did not <b>requite</b> his love.</i>
<b>restitution</b>	Getting something back again. <i><b>Restitution</b> of the damaged mucosa.</i>
<b>reward</b>	Bestow honor or rewards upon. <i>A slap on the face was his <b>reward</b> for his cheek.</i>
<b>unpaid</b>	Not paid. <i>An <b>unpaid</b> bill.</i>
