All customs duties **accrue**d to the federal government.

Exchange for cash. cash

The staff were paid in **cash**.

The action or process of awarding compensation. compensation

A compensation claim.

A person to whom money is owed by a debtor; someone to whom an

obligation exists. creditor

He sold his Ferraris to pay off his **creditor**s.



debt The state of owing something (especially money.

The firm is heavily in **debt**.

earnings Income derived from an investment or product.

They saved a quarter of all their **earnings**.

gratis Costing nothing.

Gratis books.

installment A payment of part of a debt; usually paid at regular intervals.

Convert (assets) into cash.

liquidate If the company was **liquidate**d there would be enough funds released to

honour the debts.

lucrative Producing a sizeable profit.

A **lucrative** career as a stand up comedian.

overdue Past due; not paid at the scheduled time.

An **overdue** installment.

Owe something especially money to.

This new theory **owe**s much to Einstein s Relativity Theory.

owing Owed as a debt.

No rent was owing.

Involving gainful employment in something often done as a hobby.

Five weeks **paid** holiday a year.

recompense Compensation or reward given for loss or harm suffered or effort made.

Substantial damages were paid in **recompense**.

Money returned to a payer.

refund If you re not delighted with your purchase we guarantee to **refund** your

money in full.

reimbursement A sum paid to cover money that has been spent or lost.

The family received insurance **reimbursements**.

remunerate Pay (someone) for services rendered or work done.

My efforts were not **remunerate**d.



remuneration Something that remunerates.

Adequate **remuneration** for his work.

remunerative Producing a sizeable profit.

Remunerative work.

Make repayment for or return something.

Most of his fortune had been spent repay

Most of his fortune had been spent **repay**ing creditors.

repayment An amount of money paid back.

Minimum monthly **repayment**s.

requite Make appropriate return for (a favour, service, or wrongdoing.

She did not **requite** his love.

restitution Getting something back again.

Restitution of the damaged mucosa.

reward Bestow honor or rewards upon.

A slap on the face was his **reward** for his cheek.

unpaid Not paid.

An **unpaid** bill.
