dipper	A cluster of seven stars in Ursa Minor at the end of the dipper s handle is Polaris.
estate car	A major social class or order of persons regarded collectively as part of the body politic of the country (especially in the United Kingdom) and formerly possessing distinct political rights.
gig	A light, fast, narrow boat adapted for rowing or sailing. <i>They played a gig in New Jersey.</i>
hackney	A compact breed of harness horse. <i>A hackney coach.</i>
hansom	A two-wheeled horse-drawn covered carriage with the driver's seat above and behind the passengers.
landau	A four-wheel covered carriage with a roof divided into two parts (front and back) that can be let down separately.
paddy wagon	Any of various kinds of wheeled vehicles drawn by an animal or a tractor.
patrol wagon	A detachment used for security or reconnaissance.
plough	Land that has been ploughed. <i>She saw a brown strip of plough.</i>
police van	The force of policemen and officers.
police wagon	The force of policemen and officers.
pullman	Luxurious passenger car; for day or night travel.
station waggon	The position where someone (as a guard or sentry) stands or is assigned to stand.
station wagon	The position where someone (as a guard or sentry) stands or is assigned to stand.
<u>trap</u>	A device to hurl clay pigeons into the air for trapshooters. <i>A bear trap.</i>
van	A caravan. <i>He had been watching the marshalling of the fish vans.</i>
waggon	Any of various kinds of wheeled vehicles drawn by an animal or a tractor.
wain	A wagon or cart.

equipage	A vehicle with wheels drawn by one or more horses.
hackney	A carriage for hire. <i>A hackney coach.</i>
hitch	Travel by hitch hiking. <i>Thomas hitched the pony to his cart.</i>
jalopy	An old car in a dilapidated condition. <i>His father got worried about him driving that old jalopy it wasn't safe.</i>
limousine	A passenger vehicle carrying people to and from an airport. <i>The Prince was whisked away in a black limousine.</i>
motorcycle	Ride a motorcycle.
motorist	The driver of a car.
pedal	Move by working the pedals of a bicycle. <i>He was coming down the path on his bike pedalling hard.</i>
ride	Ride over along or through. <i>I took them for a ride in the van.</i>
station	A bus or coach station. <i>A radio station.</i>
streetcar	A wheeled vehicle that runs on rails and is propelled by electricity.
subway	A tunnel under a road for use by pedestrians. <i>A subway station.</i>
surrey	A light four-wheeled horse-drawn carriage; has two or four seats.
taxi	A boat or other means of transportation used in the same way as a taxi. <i>He taxied the plane to the very end of the airstrip.</i>
terminal	Suffering from or relating to a terminal disease. <i>The terminal segments of the antennae.</i>

train Undergo training or instruction in preparation for a particular role function or profession.

tram Travel by tram.
*A **tramcar** carries coal out of a coal mine.*

transporter A person or thing that transports something.

van A caravan.
