<b>paseo</b>	A path set aside for walking.
<b>path</b>	A course of conduct. <i>Genius usually follows a revolutionary <b>path</b>.</i>
<b>pathway</b>	A route, formed by a chain of nerve cells, along which impulses of a particular kind usually travel. <i>A tree lined <b>pathway</b>.</i>

- promenade** A march of all the guests at the opening of a formal dance.  
*An evening **promenade**.*
- ride** A mechanical device that you ride for amusement or excitement.  
*I took them for a **ride** in the van.*
- towpath** A path beside a river or canal, originally used as a pathway for horses towing barges.
- track** The soundtrack of a film or video.  
*The undercarriage was fully retractable inwards into the wing with a 90 inch **track**.*
- trackway** A path formed by the repeated treading of people or animals.  
*A narrow beaten **trackway** into the forest.*
- trail** A trailer for a film or broadcast.  
*We drove down in a **trail** of tourist cars.*
- walk** A path set aside for walking.  
***Walking** is a healthy form of exercise.*





## Associations of "Walkway" (30 Words)

<b><u>across</u></b>	From one side to the other of a place, area, etc. <i>A crater some 30 metres <b>across</b>.</i>
<b>banister</b>	A single upright at the side of a staircase. <i>She peered over the <b>banisters</b>.</i>
<b>boulevard</b>	A wide street in a town or city, typically one lined with trees. <i>Sunset <b>Boulevard</b>.</i>
<b><u>bridge</u></b>	The central part of a pair of glasses fitting over the bridge of the nose. <i>Earlier attempts to <b>bridge</b> St George s Channel had failed.</i>
<b>building</b>	The occupants of a building. <i>The <b>building</b> of democracy in Guatemala.</i>
<b>colonnade</b>	Structure consisting of a row of evenly spaced columns.
<b><u>cross</u></b>	A cross as an emblem of Christianity. <i>A hybrid tea was <b>crossed</b> with a polyantha rose.</i>
<b><u>crossover</u></b>	The appropriation of a new style (especially in popular music) by combining elements of different genres in order to appeal to a wider audience. <i>A <b>crossover</b> study.</i>
<b>double</b>	A double measure of spirits. <i>Large <b>double</b> blooms.</i>
<b>drawbridge</b>	A bridge, especially one over a castle's moat, which is hinged at one end so that it may be raised to prevent people crossing or to allow vessels to pass under it. <i>There was a rattle of chains as the <b>drawbridge</b> was lowered.</i>
<b>elevator</b>	A platform or compartment housed in a shaft for raising and lowering people or things to different levels; a lift. <i><b>Elevators</b> of the upper lip.</i>
<b>escalator</b>	A stairway whose steps move continuously on a circulating belt.
<b><u>hall</u></b>	A college or university building containing living quarters for students. <i>For a brief time they had shared a room in <b>hall</b>.</i>
<b>highway</b>	(chiefly in official use) a public road. <i>The <b>highway</b> to success.</i>
<b><u>intersection</u></b>	An act of intersecting. <i>A red light at the <b>intersection</b> with Brompton Road.</i>
<b>landing</b>	An intermediate platform in a staircase. <i>The D Day <b>landings</b>.</i>

<b>lean</b>	Cause to lean or incline. <i>He <b>leaned</b> his elbows on the table.</i>
<b>overpass</b>	Bridge formed by the upper level of a crossing of two highways at different levels. <i>Did not its sublimity <b>overpass</b> a little the bounds of the ridiculous.</i>
<b>path</b>	A way especially designed for a particular use. <i>The <b>path</b> of virtue.</i>
<b>pavement</b>	A raised paved or asphalted path for pedestrians at the side of a road. <i>The <b>pavements</b> and columns of these ancient ruins provided the material for more recent structures.</i>
<b>pedestrian</b>	Lacking inspiration or excitement; dull. <i>A <b>pedestrian</b> movie plot.</i>
<b>railing</b>	Material for making rails or rails collectively. <i>Wrought iron <b>railings</b>.</i>
<b>road</b>	A railroad. <i>He had to work in a <b>road</b> about six feet wide.</i>
<b>roadway</b>	The part of a road intended for vehicles, in contrast to the pavement or verge.
<b>route</b>	Send via a specific route. <i>Proposals have been put forward for a new <b>route</b> around the south of the town.</i>
<b>skyway</b>	A raised motorway. <i><b>Skyways</b> from 18 000 to 40 000 feet resemble a highway system.</i>
<b>staircase</b>	A way of access (upward and downward) consisting of a set of steps. <i>He descended the broad <b>staircase</b>.</i>
<b>stairway</b>	A way of access (upward and downward) consisting of a set of steps. <i>A narrow stone <b>stairway</b>.</i>
<b>traverse</b>	An area of land surveyed with a traverse. <i>A moving catwalk that <b>traversed</b> a vast cavernous space.</i>
<b>walk</b>	Make walk. <i>He could <b>walk</b> on his hands carrying a plate on one foot.</i>
