pathway	A route, formed by a chain of nerve cells, along which impulses of a particular kind usually travel. <i>A tree lined pathway.</i>

- promenade** A march of all the guests at the opening of a formal dance.
*An evening **promenade**.*
- ride** A mechanical device that you ride for amusement or excitement.
*I took them for a **ride** in the van.*
- towpath** A path beside a river or canal, originally used as a pathway for horses towing barges.
- track** The soundtrack of a film or video.
*The undercarriage was fully retractable inwards into the wing with a 90 inch **track**.*
- trackway** A path formed by the repeated treading of people or animals.
*A narrow beaten **trackway** into the forest.*
- trail** A trailer for a film or broadcast.
*We drove down in a **trail** of tourist cars.*
- walk** A path set aside for walking.
***Walking** is a healthy form of exercise.*

across	From one side to the other of a place, area, etc. <i>A crater some 30 metres across.</i>
banister	A single upright at the side of a staircase. <i>She peered over the banisters.</i>
boulevard	A wide street in a town or city, typically one lined with trees. <i>Sunset Boulevard.</i>
bridge	The central part of a pair of glasses fitting over the bridge of the nose. <i>Earlier attempts to bridge St George s Channel had failed.</i>
building	The occupants of a building. <i>The building of democracy in Guatemala.</i>
colonnade	Structure consisting of a row of evenly spaced columns.
cross	A cross as an emblem of Christianity. <i>A hybrid tea was crossed with a polyantha rose.</i>
crossover	The appropriation of a new style (especially in popular music) by combining elements of different genres in order to appeal to a wider audience. <i>A crossover study.</i>
double	A double measure of spirits. <i>Large double blooms.</i>
drawbridge	A bridge, especially one over a castle's moat, which is hinged at one end so that it may be raised to prevent people crossing or to allow vessels to pass under it. <i>There was a rattle of chains as the drawbridge was lowered.</i>
elevator	A platform or compartment housed in a shaft for raising and lowering people or things to different levels; a lift. <i>Elevators of the upper lip.</i>
escalator	A stairway whose steps move continuously on a circulating belt.
hall	A college or university building containing living quarters for students. <i>For a brief time they had shared a room in hall.</i>
highway	(chiefly in official use) a public road. <i>The highway to success.</i>
intersection	An act of intersecting. <i>A red light at the intersection with Brompton Road.</i>
landing	An intermediate platform in a staircase. <i>The D Day landings.</i>

lean	Cause to lean or incline. <i>He leaned his elbows on the table.</i>
overpass	Bridge formed by the upper level of a crossing of two highways at different levels. <i>Did not its sublimity overpass a little the bounds of the ridiculous.</i>
path	A way especially designed for a particular use. <i>The path of virtue.</i>
pavement	A raised paved or asphalted path for pedestrians at the side of a road. <i>The pavements and columns of these ancient ruins provided the material for more recent structures.</i>
pedestrian	Lacking inspiration or excitement; dull. <i>A pedestrian movie plot.</i>
railing	Material for making rails or rails collectively. <i>Wrought iron railings.</i>
road	A railroad. <i>He had to work in a road about six feet wide.</i>
roadway	The part of a road intended for vehicles, in contrast to the pavement or verge.
route	Send via a specific route. <i>Proposals have been put forward for a new route around the south of the town.</i>
skyway	A raised motorway. <i>Skyways from 18 000 to 40 000 feet resemble a highway system.</i>
staircase	A way of access (upward and downward) consisting of a set of steps. <i>He descended the broad staircase.</i>
stairway	A way of access (upward and downward) consisting of a set of steps. <i>A narrow stone stairway.</i>
traverse	An area of land surveyed with a traverse. <i>A moving catwalk that traversed a vast cavernous space.</i>
walk	Make walk. <i>He could walk on his hands carrying a plate on one foot.</i>
