### Definitions of "Wand" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “wand” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A rod thought to have magic properties, used in casting spells or performing conjuring tricks.*
- *A small stick with a brush at one end used to apply mascara.*
- *A thin tapered rod used by a conductor to lead an orchestra or choir.*
- *A conductor's baton.*
- *One of the suits in some tarot packs, corresponding to batons in others.*
- *A rod used by a magician or water diviner.*
- *Each of a pair of handheld lights used by a person on the ground to guide a taxiing aircraft at night.*
- *A thin supple twig or rod.*
- *A staff or rod held as a symbol of office.*
- *A ceremonial or emblematic staff.*
- *A device emitting a laser beam, used especially to create a pointer on a projected image or text.*
- *A long, thin stick or rod.*
- *A handheld electronic device which can be passed over a barcode to read the encoded data.*



## Synonyms of "Wand" as a noun (11 Words)

- bar** The profession of barrister.  
*An electric fire with three **bars**.*
- baton** A short stick or tube passed from runner to runner in a relay race.  
***Batons** of cheddar cheese.*
- dowel** A fastener that is inserted into holes in two adjacent pieces and holds them together.
- pole** A long slender flexible rod of wood or fibreglass used by a competitor in pole vaulting.  
*They tell you on the tin that their tuna is entirely caught with **pole** and line.*
- rod** Any rod shaped bacterium.  
*The largest carp ever caught on **rod** and line in Britain.*
- scepter** The imperial authority symbolized by a scepter.
- sceptre** A ceremonial or emblematic staff.  
*Imperial regalia of orb and **sceptre**.*
- staff** The body of teachers and administrators at a school.  
*A **staff** of 600.*
- stake** A pole or stake set up to mark something as the start or end of a race track.  
*Bishop Ridley was burned at the **stake**.*
- stick** In field hockey the foul play of raising the stick above the shoulder.  
*The kid had a candied apple on a **stick**.*
- verge** An edge of tiles projecting over a gable.  
*On the **verge** of tears.*



## Usage Examples of "Wand" as a noun

- *Stems bearing slender wands of flowers.*
- *He waves the computer wand over the special barcode.*
- *A mascara wand.*
- *The beadle rapped noisily with his wand.*
- *The fairy godmother waves her magic wand and grants the heroine's wishes.*
- *You pull out a laser wand and point at the screen on the wall.*
