- A thin tapered rod used by a conductor to lead an orchestra or choir.
- A conductor's baton.
- One of the suits in some tarot packs, corresponding to batons in others.
- A rod used by a magician or water diviner.
- Each of a pair of handheld lights used by a person on the ground to guide a taxiing aircraft at night.
- A thin supple twig or rod.
- A staff or rod held as a symbol of office.
- A ceremonial or emblematic staff.
- A device emitting a laser beam, used especially to create a pointer on a projected image or text.
- A long, thin stick or rod.
- A handheld electronic device which can be passed over a barcode to read the encoded data.
