<a href="#">ailing</a>	Somewhat ill or prone to illness. <i>The <b>ailing</b> economy.</i>
<b>anemia</b>	A lack of vitality.
<a href="#">anemic</a>	Relating to anemia or suffering from anemia. <i>An <b>anemic</b> attempt to hit the baseball.</i>
<b>blanch</b>	Flinch or grow pale from shock, fear, or a similar emotion. <i>He visibly <b>blanched</b> at this reminder of mortality.</i>
<b>complexion</b>	Give a certain color to. <i>A liberal political <b>complexion</b>.</i>
<b>dark</b>	Having a dark hue. <i>Matthew flashed a <b>dark</b> look at her.</i>
<a href="#">dim</a>	Made dim or less bright. <i>The <b>dim</b> glow of the fire.</i>
<b>face</b>	Turn so as to face turn the face in a certain direction. <i><b>Face</b> a playing card.</i>
<b>fading</b>	Weakening in force or intensity.
<b>flagging</b>	Becoming tired or less dynamic; declining in strength. <i>There was a pile of <b>flagging</b> waiting to be laid in place.</i>
<b>fragility</b>	Lack of physical strength. <i>Osteoporosis is characterized by bone <b>fragility</b>.</i>
<a href="#">hue</a>	A colour or shade. <i>Verdigris is greenish yellow in <b>hue</b>.</i>
<a href="#">ill</a>	Presaging ill fortune P B Shelley. <i><b>Ill</b> fitting clothes.</i>
<b>jaundice</b>	Affect with or as if with jaundice. <i>Jealousy had <b>jaundiced</b> his judgment.</i>

<b>limp</b>	A tendency to limp a gait impeded by injury or stiffness. <i>A <b>limp</b> gesture as if waving away all desire to know.</i>
<b>moonbeam</b>	A ray of moonlight.
<b>pale</b>	Become pale in one's face from shock or fear. <i>I <b>paled</b> at the thought of what she might say.</i>
<b>pallid</b>	Lacking in intensity or brightness; dim or feeble. <i>A <b>pallid</b> performance.</i>
<b>pallor</b>	Unnatural lack of color in the skin (as from bruising or sickness or emotional distress). <i>The deathlike <b>pallor</b> of his face.</i>
<b>pigmentation</b>	The deposition of pigment in animals or plants or human beings.
<b>powerless</b>	Without ability, influence, or power. <i>Troops were <b>powerless</b> to stop last night's shooting.</i>
<b>sallow</b>	Cause to become sallow. <i><b>Sallow</b> faced addicts.</i>
<b>sensitization</b>	The process of becoming highly sensitive to specific events or situations (especially emotional events or situations). <i>Common gut bacteria prevent <b>sensitization</b> to allergens.</i>
<b>sick</b>	People who are sick. <i>The British economy remains <b>sick</b>.</i>
<b>swarthy</b>	Dark-complexioned. <i>A smile on his <b>swarthy</b> face.</i>
<b>tint</b>	Dye someone's hair with a tint. <i>They spent hours having their hair <b>tinted</b> and set.</i>
<b>undermine</b>	Destroy property or hinder normal operations. <i>The flow of water had <b>undermined</b> pillars supporting the roof.</i>
<b>weak</b>	Relating to or denoting the weakest of the known kinds of force between particles which acts only at distances less than about 10 cm is very much weaker than the electromagnetic and the strong interactions and conserves neither strangeness parity nor isospin. <i>A <b>weak</b> president.</i>
<b>white</b>	Trousers made of flannel or gabardine or tweed or white cloth. <i>Garnet red flowers flecked with <b>white</b>.</i>
<b>yellow</b>	Affected by jaundice which causes yellowing of skin etc. <i>He based his judgement on headlines and <b>yellow</b> journalism.</i>
