## **Warmly as an Adverb**

### **Definitions of "Warmly" as an adverb**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “warmly” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In a way that shows friendliness towards a person or enthusiasm for an idea or project.*
- *With colours containing red, yellow, or orange tones.*
- *Using clothes or coverings that help the body to retain heat.*
- *In a hearty manner.*
- *In a way that gives out warmth; with comfortable heat.*
- *In a warm manner.*



## Synonyms of "Warmly" as an adverb (3 Words)

- cordially** With intense feeling.  
*He was **cordially** detested for his brutality and injustice.*
- heartily** In a hearty manner.  
*They were **heartily** sick of the whole subject.*
- warm** In a warm manner.  
***Warmly** dressed.*

*Adoring grandparents.*

<b>affection</b>	The action or process of affecting or being affected. <i>She felt <b>affection</b> for the wise old lady.</i>
<b>affectionate</b>	Having or displaying warmth or affection. <i>An <b>affectionate</b> kiss.</i>
<b>balmy</b>	Mild and pleasant. <i>The <b>balmy</b> days of late summer.</i>
<b>caring</b>	A loving feeling. <i>A <b>caring</b> and invaluable friend.</i>
<b>celsius</b>	Swedish astronomer who devised the centigrade thermometer (1701-1744).
<b>cherish</b>	Keep (a hope or ambition) in one's mind. <i>He had long <b>cherished</b> a secret fantasy about his future.</i>
<b>clement</b>	Inclined to show mercy. <i>A more <b>clement</b> judge reduced the sentence.</i>
<b>cordial</b>	A sweet fruit-flavoured drink. <i>A tall glass of blackcurrant <b>cordial</b>.</i>
<b>cozy</b>	Enjoying or affording comforting warmth and shelter especially in a small space. <i>A <b>cozy</b> nook near the fire.</i>
<b>doting</b>	Extravagantly or foolishly loving and indulgent. <i>She was spoiled outrageously by her <b>doting</b> father.</i>
<b>embrace</b>	Accept (a belief, theory, or change) willingly and enthusiastically. <i>His career <b>embraces</b> a number of activities composing playing and acting.</i>
<b>embracement</b>	The act of clasping another person in the arms (as in greeting or affection).
<b>enamored</b>	Marked by foolish or unreasoning fondness. <i>Narcissus was a beautiful Greek youth who became <b>enamored</b> of his own reflection.</i>
<b>fond</b>	Having an affection or liking for. <i><b>Fond</b> fancies.</i>
<b>fondly</b>	With foolishly optimistic hope or belief; naively. <i>He talks <b>fondly</b> of his grandfather.</i>
<b>friendly</b>	Not seriously or unpleasantly competitive or divisive. <i>A consumer <b>friendly</b> policy.</i>
<b>fuzzy</b>	Relating to a form of set theory and logic in which predicates may have degrees of applicability, rather than simply being true or false. It has important uses in artificial intelligence and the design of control systems. <i><b>Fuzzy</b> fake fur throw pillows.</i>

<b><u>genial</u></b>	Of or relating to the chin or median part of the lower jaw. <i>A <b>genial</b> host.</i>
<b>halfhearted</b>	Feeling or showing little interest or enthusiasm. <i>A <b>halfhearted</b> effort.</i>
<b><u>hearty</u></b>	(of a person) strong and healthy. <i>A <b>hearty</b> welcome.</i>
<b><u>hospitable</u></b>	Friendly and welcoming to visitors or guests. <i>Two friendly <b>hospitable</b> brothers run the hotel.</i>
<b><u>hug</u></b>	Fit closely or tightly. <i>A pair of jeans that <b>hugged</b> the contours of his body.</i>
<b>loving</b>	Feeling or showing love or great care. <i>The cargo was described in <b>loving</b> detail.</i>
<b><u>lovingly</u></b>	With love or great care. <i>They smile <b>lovingly</b> at each other.</i>
<b>lukewarm</b>	Moderately warm. <i>He hates <b>lukewarm</b> coffee.</i>
<b>soft</b>	In a relaxed manner or without hardship soft is nonstandard. <i>The ground was <b>soft</b> beneath their feet.</i>
<b>temperate</b>	Free from extremes; mild; or characteristic of such weather or climate. <i><b>Temperate</b> in his response to criticism.</i>
<b><u>tender</u></b>	Make tender or more tender as by marinating pounding or applying a tenderizer. <i>A <b>tender</b> heart.</i>
<b>tepid</b>	(especially of a liquid) only slightly warm; lukewarm. <i>The applause was <b>tepid</b>.</i>
