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## Associations of "Warned" (30 Words)

<a href="#">admonish</a>	Admonish or counsel in terms of someone s behavior. <i>He <b>admonished</b> the child for his bad behavior.</i>
<a href="#">beware</a>	Be on one’s guard; be cautious or wary about; be alert to. <i>We should <b>beware</b> the incompetence of legislators.</i>
<b>carefulness</b>	The quality of being careful and painstaking. <i>I admired the <b>carefulness</b> of his work.</i>
<b>caution</b>	The trait of being cautious; being attentive to possible danger. <i>He exercised <b>caution</b> in opening the door.</i>
<a href="#">cautious</a>	People who are fearful and cautious. <i>Reserved and <b>cautious</b> never making swift decisions.</i>
<b>caveat</b>	A formal notice filed with a court or officer to suspend a proceeding until filer is given a hearing. <i>A <b>caveat</b> filed against the probate of a will.</i>
<b>ensorious</b>	Severely critical of others. <i>Was <b>ensorious</b> of petty failings.</i>
<b>censure</b>	The state of being excommunicated. <i>Shareholders <b>censured</b> the bank for its extravagance.</i>
<b>circumspection</b>	The trait of being circumspect and prudent. <i><b>Circumspection</b> is required in the day to day exercise of administrative powers.</i>
<b>danger</b>	A dangerous place. <i>His life was in <b>danger</b>.</i>
<a href="#">discreet</a>	Heedful of potential consequences. <i>A <b>discreet</b> investor.</i>
<b>expostulate</b>	Express strong disapproval or disagreement. <i>He found Fox <b>expostulating</b> with a young man.</i>
<b>expostulation</b>	The act of expressing earnest opposition or protest.

<b><u>forewarn</u></b>	Warn in advance or beforehand; give an early warning. <i>I <b>forewarned</b> him of the trouble that would arise if he showed up at his ex wife s house.</i>
<b>gingerly</b>	In a gingerly manner. <i>The issue was handled only in a <b>gingerly</b> way.</i>
<b><u>harangue</u></b>	Deliver a harangue to address forcefully. <i>They were subjected to a ten minute <b>harangue</b> by two border guards.</i>
<b><u>hazard</u></b>	The pocketing of the object ball. <i>We can form no calculation concerning the laws of <b>hazard</b>.</i>
<b>incrimination</b>	An accusation that you are responsible for some lapse or misdeed. <i>His <b>incrimination</b> was based on my testimony.</i>
<b>message</b>	Send a message. <i>She <b>messaged</b> the committee.</i>
<b>modesty</b>	Formality and propriety of manner. <i>The <b>modesty</b> of his political aspirations.</i>
<b>prudence</b>	Discretion in practical affairs. <i>We need to exercise <b>prudence</b> in such important matters.</i>
<b><u>rebuke</u></b>	Express sharp disapproval or criticism of (someone) because of their behaviour or actions. <i>He had to take the <b>rebuke</b> with a smile on his face.</i>
<b>repeatedly</b>	Over and over again; constantly. <i>They have been warned <b>repeatedly</b> with no effect.</i>
<b>reproach</b>	In the Roman Catholic Church a set of antiphons and responses for Good Friday representing the reproaches of Christ to his people. <i>A farrago of warnings and pained <b>reproaches</b>.</i>
<b>reproof</b>	Censure severely or angrily. <i>She welcomed him with a mild <b>reproof</b> for leaving her alone.</i>
<b>scolding</b>	Rebuking a person harshly. <i>She d get a <b>scolding</b> from Victoria.</i>
<b>sternly</b>	In a serious and severe manner, especially when asserting authority or exercising discipline. <i>A fight had ensued which <b>sternly</b> tested my peace making skills.</i>
<b>thoughtful</b>	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>A deeply <b>thoughtful</b> essay.</i>
<b>warning</b>	Advance notice of something. <i>A word of <b>warning</b> don t park illegally.</i>
