- belligerent** Characteristic of an enemy or one eager to fight.
*The mood at the meeting was **belligerent**.*
- clashing** Sharply and harshly discordant.
***Clashing** colors.*
- conflicting** Incompatible or at variance; contradictory.
***Conflicting** opinions.*
- fighting** Displaying or engaging in violence, combat, or aggression.
*Review the **fighting** forces.*
- [militant](#)** Favoured confrontational or violent methods in support of a political or social cause.
***Militant** in fighting for better wages for workers.*
- opposing** In conflict or competition with someone or something.
*The brothers fought on **opposing** sides in the war.*
- war-ridden** Engaged in war.

- activism** A policy of taking direct and militant action to achieve a political or social goal.
*Growing **activism** on the abortion issue.*
- activist** A militant reformer.
*A committed animal rights **activist**.*
- aggressive** Behaving or done in a determined and forceful way.
*We needed more growth to pursue our **aggressive** acquisition strategy.*
- argumentative** Using or characterized by systematic reasoning.
*An intelligent but **argumentative** child.*
- army** The army of the United States of America the agency that organizes and trains soldiers for land warfare.
*He joined the **army** at 16.*

barbaric	Savagely cruel. Barbaric use of color or ornament.
bellicose	Demonstrating aggression and willingness to fight. Bellicose young officers.
belligerent	Characteristic of an enemy or one eager to fight. <i>Ships and goods captured at sea by a belligerent.</i>
combatant	A person engaged in conflict or competition with another. <i>In the long Russo Swedish conflict both combatants endured terrible sacrifices.</i>
combative	Ready or eager to fight or argue. <i>He made some enemies with his combative style.</i>
competitive	Involving competition or competitiveness. <i>Highly competitive sales representative.</i>
<u>confrontational</u>	Of or relating to confrontation. <i>He distanced himself from the confrontational approach adopted by his predecessor.</i>
crossfire	A lively or heated interchange of ideas and opinions. <i>A photographer was killed in crossfire.</i>
demobilize	Cease military operations. <i>He was demobilized in February 1946.</i>
<u>disarm</u>	Make less hostile; win over. <i>Police yesterday disarmed a parcel bomb.</i>
fighter	A person or animal that fights. <i>World War II fighter planes.</i>
<u>hostile</u>	Characterized by enmity or ill will. Hostile tender offer.
<u>hostility</u>	A hostile (very unfriendly) disposition. <i>He could no longer contain his hostility.</i>
invader	Someone who enters by force in order to conquer. <i>The arrival of Spanish invaders.</i>
martial	Roman poet noted for epigrams (first century BC). Martial law.
<u>menacing</u>	Suggesting the presence of danger; threatening. <i>Our officers encountered menacing looks from teenagers.</i>
<u>militant</u>	A militant person. <i>The army are in conflict with militant groups.</i>

<u>military</u>	Characteristic of or associated with soldiers or the military. <i>As a young man he joined the military and pursued a career in the Army.</i>
militia	A military force that is raised from the civil population to supplement a regular army in an emergency. <i>Their troops were untrained militia.</i>
pugnacious	Ready and able to resort to force or violence- Herman Melville. <i>His public statements became increasingly pugnacious.</i>
scrappy	Determined, argumentative, or pugnacious. <i>He had a scrappy New York temperament.</i>
<u>truculent</u>	Eager or quick to argue or fight; aggressively defiant. <i>A truculent speech against the new government.</i>
<u>war</u>	A legal state created by a declaration of war and ended by official declaration during which the international rules of war apply. <i>Japan declared war on Germany.</i>
<u>warlike</u>	Suggesting war or military life. <i>A warlike clan.</i>
<u>warrior</u>	(especially in former times) a brave or experienced soldier or fighter. <i>I really love the warrior pose it makes me feel centred and strong.</i>
