Definitions of "Warrior" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “warrior” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Someone engaged in or experienced in warfare.*
- *Any of a number of standing poses in yoga in which the legs are held apart and the arms are stretched outwards.*
- *(especially in former times) a brave or experienced soldier or fighter.*



Synonyms of "Warrior" as a noun (5 Words)

combatant	Someone who fights (or is fighting). <i>In the long Russo Swedish conflict both combatants endured terrible sacrifices.</i>
fighter	Someone who fights (or is fighting). <i>There ll be months of physiotherapy but medical staff say she s a fighter.</i>
fighting man	The act of fighting; any contest or struggle.
serviceman	Someone who serves in the armed forces; a member of a military force.
<u>soldier</u>	A private in an army. <i>The soldiers stood at attention.</i>

- *I really love the warrior pose—it makes me feel centred and strong.*

- armament** The process of equipping military forces for war.
*National **armaments** could be kept to a minimum.*
- army** The army of the United States of America the agency that organizes and trains soldiers for land warfare.
*He joined the **army** at 16.*
- battle** Battle or contend against in or as if in a battle.

- belligerent** Engaged in war.

<u>castle</u>	A magnificent and imposing old mansion. <i>Both of the players castled on the queenside.</i>
<u>citadel</u>	A stronghold into which people could go for shelter during a battle. <i>The garrison withdrew into the citadel.</i>
<u>commander</u>	A rank of naval officer above lieutenant commander and below captain. <i>The commander of a paratroop regiment.</i>
crossfire	Fire from two or more points so that the lines of fire cross. <i>The sponsors are caught in the crossfire of the battle between the world champion and his team boss.</i>
<u>disarm</u>	Deprive of the power to hurt. <i>Police yesterday disarmed a parcel bomb.</i>
flotilla	A fleet of small craft. <i>A flotilla of cargo boats.</i>
<u>fort</u>	Gather in or as if in a fort as for protection or defense. <i>The city was guarded by a ring of forts.</i>
<u>fortress</u>	A person or thing not susceptible to outside influence or disturbance. <i>He had proved himself to be a fortress of moral rectitude.</i>
garrison	The building occupied by a garrison. <i>The entire garrison was mustered on the parade ground.</i>
<u>hostile</u>	Unsolicited and resisted by the management of the target company (used of attempts to buy or take control of a business. <i>Hostile bid.</i>
legionary	A soldier who is a member of a legion (especially the French Foreign Legion. <i>The legionary fortress of Isca.</i>
<u>militant</u>	A militant reformer. <i>Militants became increasingly impatient of parliamentary manoeuvres.</i>
<u>military</u>	The military forces of a nation. <i>Military uniforms.</i>
naval	Connected with or belonging to or used in a navy. <i>A naval officer.</i>
navy	The navy of the United States of America the agency that maintains and trains and equips combat ready naval forces. <i>She joined the navy in 1990.</i>
<u>siege</u>	The action of an armed force that surrounds a fortified place and isolates it while continuing to attack. <i>Siege warfare.</i>

- soldier** Serve as a soldier in the military.
*The **soldiers** stood at attention.*
- stouthearted** Used especially of persons.
*A **stouthearted** fellow who had an active career in the army.*
- submarine** Attack by submarine.
*The Germans **submarined** the Allies.*
- warfare** An active struggle between competing entities.
*Diplomatic **warfare**.*
- warlike** (of plans, preparations, or munitions) directed towards or prepared for war.
***Warlike** policies.*
- warmonger** A person who encourages or advocates aggression towards other countries or groups.
- warring** Engaged in war.
*A **warring** couple.*
- warship** A ship equipped with weapons and designed to take part in warfare at sea.
