abide	(of a feeling or memory) continue without fading or being lost. <i>At least one memory will abide.</i>
being	Being alive living. <i>Holism promotes a unified way of being.</i>
coexistence	The state or fact of living or existing at the same time or in the same place. <i>A harmonious coexistence between wildlife and livestock.</i>
concurrent	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>She was given nine months concurrent for each offence.</i>
constitute	Combine to form (a whole). <i>His failure to act constituted a breach of duty.</i>
creature	A person or organization considered to be under the complete control of another. <i>The village teacher was expected to be the creature of his employer.</i>
dwell	Exist or be situated within. <i>The problems dwell in the social injustices in this country.</i>
dweller	A person who inhabits a particular place. <i>City dwellers.</i>
eternally	In a way that continues or lasts forever; permanently. <i>I shall be eternally grateful.</i>
exist	Have an existence be extant. <i>He could barely exist on such a low wage.</i>
existence	A way of living. <i>A person may be reaping the consequences of evil deeds sown in previous existences.</i>
existing	Existing in something specified. <i>Depletion of the oxygen existing in the bloodstream.</i>

<u>extant</u>	Still in existence; surviving. <i>Extant manuscripts.</i>
happen	Happen occur or be the case in the course of events or by chance. <i>I happened upon the most wonderful bakery not very far from here.</i>
<u>here</u>	In or at this place where the speaker or writer is. <i>Here s a dish that is quick to make.</i>
<u>inhabit</u>	Be an inhabitant of or reside in. <i>The people inhabited the islands that are now deserted.</i>
<u>lifelong</u>	Continuing through life. <i>A lifelong friend.</i>
live	Remain alive. <i>The doctors said she had only six months to live.</i>
<u>living</u>	The condition of living or the state of being alive. <i>Carved into the living stone.</i>
maintenance	Means of maintenance of a family or group. <i>Crucial conditions for the maintenance of democratic government.</i>
occur	To be found to exist. <i>Precious stones occur in a large area in Brazil.</i>
outlast	Live longer than. <i>The kind of beauty that will outlast youth.</i>
<u>pertain</u>	Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time. <i>My remark pertained to your earlier comments.</i>
populate	Cause people to settle in (a place). <i>A cosy rural town populated with friendly folk.</i>
recur	Go back to (something) in thought or speech. <i>Oglethorpe s words kept recurring to him.</i>
<u>reside</u>	(of power or a right) belong to a person or body. <i>The meaning of an utterance does not wholly reside in the semantic meaning.</i>
somewhere	In or at or to some place someplace is used informally for somewhere. <i>I ve seen you somewhere before.</i>
stay	Stay behind. <i>Stay stand apart I know not which is which.</i>
subsist	Remain in force or effect. <i>He subsisted on welfare and casual labour.</i>
<u>survive</u>	Continue to live through hardship or adversity. <i>He has survived several assassination attempts.</i>
